

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

EUROPEAN.

DEUBLIN, Oct. 15.

Immense satisfaction is felt here at the prospect of the prosecution of the Land League. On the first day of the term, Nov. 2nd, motion will be made for a conditional order for criminal information against Parnell and other leaders. The whole question of the legality or illegality of the League will be gone into.

In view of the abortive proceedings against Davitt, Daly and Killen, the government has abandoned the idea of proceeding by summons or arrest, and has determined to move on the 2nd November, in Queen's Bench Division for a conditional order for criminal information against the leaders of the Land League.

LONDON, Oct. 15.

All four of the prisoners in custody on suspicion of being concerned in the murder of Lord Mountmorris last month were liberated to-day, the only witness examined at the magisterial enquiry being unable to identify any of them as persons he met on the road at the time the murder was committed.

PARIS, Oct. 15.

Gambetta has arrived in this city. President Grevy has decided that the Municipal elections will be held on January 9.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 15.

On the nineteenth (old style) marriage with Princess Dolgorouki was solemnized in Chapel of Imperial Palace, the Czar's family disapproving. The Czarovitch went to Hospital on Ethoman coast. Grand Dukes Constantine and Vladimir were abroad in order that they might not witness the ceremony. The marriage was very private. Grand Duke Nicholas and Minister Alvar were, however, present. The newly married pair are with the bride's family in Lavadia. The Czar has purchased for his consort the Palace of Grand Duchess Catherine, paying two million roubles.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Oct. 15.

The Porte in replying to the Ambassadors for an explanation of the last Turkish note, satisfactorily assured them that the convention with Montenegro meant simply a formal agreement between the military commanders in regard to the mode in which the cession of Dulcigno was to be effected.

A despatch from Badsic, dated Oct 14, says: "According to news received by the fleet from Cettinge, up to noon yesterday, not the slightest sign was shown of ceding Dulcigno. It is generally believed here that the Sultan will not perform his promises, and that he only made them to gain time."

UNITED STATES.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.

Envelopes containing bills of exchange for cotton, worth about \$60,000, were stolen on Monday from the post office box of Schufmacher & Krone. The bills had been sent to the New York firm by Kaufman & Runge, of Galveston, Texas. On Monday two of the bills were found with a boy on Wall Street. The detectives ascertained that he found a key in the box and took the bills home, where \$50,000 were recovered. The boy was taken to the police headquarters.

TROY, N. J., Oct. 15.

At a Republican demonstration at Johnsonville, last night, Charles Nutting, Melie Welling, Charles Thomas, John Fay and a Frenchman were injured by an explosion of cannon. Nutting's leg was shattered, Welling's left arm was torn to pieces and since amputated; he will die. Thomas, aged eight, had his left leg torn to pieces and will probably die; the others were slightly injured.

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla., Oct. 15.

The United States authorities are making efforts to recover the cargo of the lost steamer City of Vera Cruz from wreckers on the coast.

NEW YORK, Oct. 15.

National Republican Committee met shortly after noon to-day with Gov. Jewell in chair. The other members present were: Wm. E. Chandler, N. H.; Edward McPherson, Pa.; J. A. Martin, Ky.; W. P. Canaday, North Carolina; W. C. Cooper, Ohio; James H. Stone, Mich.; D. M. Sabine, Minn.; Samuel Lee, South Carolina; H. S. Reynolds, Iowa; Henry Stockbridge, Md.; Christian Fabringer, Del.; S. A. Yost, Va.; J. J. Hinda, Ala.; and R. J. McCormick, Arizona. G. W. Dorsey, Congressman Tilley, and others, will arrive to-day. Addresses will be issued to the people probably this evening, on the advisability of making vigorous fight for Congressmen in certain Southern States.

INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 15.

The Executive Committee of the Democratic party of this State issue a circular to their supporters asserting their belief that Hancock will carry the ticket in November.

BOSTON, Oct. 15.
