Landings Of Sea Fish Down

OTTAWA (CP) - Landings and value of sea fish were down in April and in the first four months of the year for corresponding periods last year, the bureau of statistics reported Thursday.

April landings on both coasts in 1957 amounted to 56,697,000 pounds valued at \$3,215,000, compared with 50,503,000 pounds valued at \$3,806,000 in the corresponding month a year ago.

For the first four months, landings amounted to 346,785,000 pounds down sharply from 530,602,000 pounds a year ago, and valued at \$10,946,000 from \$14,931,000.
