## WINDSOR INCENDIARIES.

### Two Coloured Men Under Arrest.

Excitement in the Town.

WINDSOR, Oct. 22.—The colored men, Fletcher and McIntyre, are both under arrest charged with incendiarism in connection with the recent big conflagration. Two witnesses have been secured to state that they had overheard a conversation between the accused showing that they had conspired to start the fire.

It is stated that the prisoner McIntyre admitted having been with Fletcher on the morning of the fire. Evidence has been obtained that plainly indicates that Fletcher and McIntyre are closely allied. He has made a statement that, if true, should lead to a charge of the crime of arson. The evidence puts McIntyre in a very serious position. It seems to be established that he had saturated several mattresses with paraffine oil and then set them on fire. He made several unsuccessful attempts and was finally successful. Two men called out to him, but he either did not hear them or he heeded them not. Immediately following the outbreak of the fire at McIntyre's house there was an explosion. This could not be accounted for at the time. McIntyre was known by the Windsor people as the "spoolman dude." He sported rings and gold headed canes and frequently donned a beaver. Officers Lehan and McDonald, who are working on the case, say there is conclusive evidence to show that Fletcher and McIntyre are implicated in the fire. McIntyre blames Fletcher, and Fletcher blames McIntyre. McIntyre is reported to have said to an insurance agent:

"I admit I was in Fletcher's place at 2 o'clock the morning of the fire. I wanted Fletcher to go home with me. Fletcher said I have something to do before leaving. I have been served with a summons under the Canada Temperance Act, but that he would see temperance women burned in hell before long."

McIntyre was tracked by Lehan from Halifax. McIntyre came from Yarmouth five years ago. He is a divorced man. At one time he complained a girl put strychnine in his milk can. Examination found poison was in the milk, but nothing was done about it.

## HOMICIDAL MANIA.

### Atrocious Crimes of a French Shepherd.

#### Confesses to Killing Three Women, Three Girls and Three Boys.

PARIS, Oct. 22.—Ten mysterious murders and four attempts at murder that have occurred within the past two years in various parts of France, are now ascribed to the Shepherd Vacher who was arrested a few days ago at Belleme, department of Aix. Vacher, who fancies himself a hero, described the facts in connection with the crimes with evident relish. At the time of his arrest he confessed that he had killed three girls, two women and three shepherd boys. The murders were of a character similar to those committed by "Jack the Ripper" in London some years ago.

### Not Yet Fixed by Government.

OTTAWA, Oct. 22.—An order in Council fixing Thanksgiving Day for November 25th has not yet passed. The Government is being urged on all hands to make it two weeks earlier. It is contended that Canada is under no obligation to follow the lead of the United States in this matter.

#### LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

RICHMOND, Va., Oct. 20.—At Lowelburg, while Mrs. Wallace was lighting a fire yesterday, an oil can exploded. The flames spread so rapidly that she could not rescue her three small children, all of whom were burned to death.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—The British gunboats advanced up the Nile today and shelled Metemneh, the Dervish position between Berber and Khartoum and retired after inspecting it with the view of ascertaining its strength and defensive works.

NEW YORK, Oct. 20.—The funeral of Charles Dana took place at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Glen Cove, Long Island, today. The service was short and simple. The services were conducted by Rev. W. R. Huntington, rector of Grace church, this city, assisted by Rev. John Cammack, rector of the Glen Cove church. The body was interred in the cemetery adjoining the church.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—In connection with the increase in strength of the defence of the colonies of Great Britain is receiving unusual attention. The government has just despatched a former under-secretary of state for war, Sir Ralph Wood Thompson, to Australia, with instructions to report to the war office upon the condition of the defences of the Australian colonies and the increase in colonial forces, and to submit proposals for arming the local troops and exchanging battalions from Australia with those of the motherland. The mission of W. S. Fielding, the Canadian minister of finance, to Great Britain also includes discussing with the colonial office what proportion of £1,500,000, which it is proposed to expend in strengthening the Canadian defences, should be borne by the imperial government. The India council and the war office are said to be considering important measures involving the addition of one third to the strength of the Indian army.
