Rome, Oct. 28.—The Pope has granted a dispensation for the marriage of the Princess Marie, eldest daughter of the Duke of Edinburgh, and Prince Ferdinand of Roumania.

Buffalo, Ind., Oct. 28.—The family of Wm. Mazlin were poisoned yesterday by what is supposed to have been corrosive sublimate in a dish of mush which had been eaten by them.

Toronto, Oct. 28.—W. B. Jeffreys, English stockholder in the G. T. R., says he will seriously consider the proposal to reduce the fare to the rate of two cents per mile, as he thinks the increased business resulting from such a change might possibly be a remedy for the present non-paying state of the line.

Washington, Oct. 28.—A sensation has been created in the state department by the utterances of John C. Sullivan, paymaster on the Mohican, patrol ship at the sealing islands in Behring Sea.

Quebec, Oct. 28.—Proceedings in the Mercier Pacaud trial this morning were delayed until nearly eleven o'clock by the illness of one of the jurors.

London, Oct. 28.—The Times, referring to Mr. Balfour's address on binetism, says: "We regret Mr. Balfour is committed to the unsound policy of binetism. It is a serious matter when a public man of his authority undertakes a heavy responsibility for the change of which he has not yet even attempted to prove the practicability."

Ottawa, Oct. 28.—The government has been advised that Jamaica quarantine on Canadian vessels has been abolished.

London, Oct. 28.—The united press is informed on excellent authority that there is no purpose whatever on the part of the present government to annex Samoa or any part of the Great Britain; that both Mr. Gladstone and Lord Rosebery are in favor of leaving things substantially in their present condition, as far as the foreign relations of Samoa are concerned, and that any reforms that may be necessary in the local administration of Samoa will be undertaken only with the full consent of Germany and the United States.

London, Oct. 28.—The board of agriculture has not yet given a decision regarding the alleged outbreak of pleuro-pneumonia among Canadian cattle, but Principal Williams and Professor Owen Williams of the new veterinary college, Edinburgh, report that excreta taken from the animals as examined by them presents all signs of bronchial pneumonia or contagious disease, which is non-contagious. In the face of this the board of agriculture will hardly be likely to schedule Canadian cattle.

Toronto, Oct. 28.—Temperance people are considerably excited over the resignation of ex-Mayor Howland from the presidency of the Ontario branch of the Dominion Alliance.

Under False Pretences.—A Halifax despatch says: A few weeks ago Capt. Warren Baker was sent to the penitentiary for wrecking the schooner Seven Brothers. It was stated during the trial that he was induced to wreck the vessel by her owner, A. J. McDonald of Port Hood. The day after he was removed to the penitentiary an alleged statement by Baker was published completely exonerating McDonald. The prisoner now writes from Dorchester that said statement is false in every particular. He states that he was induced to sign it by one McNeill, McDonald's brother-in-law, without reading, on the pretence that it would secure the prisoner's release.
