- 6) Students are walking from N and NA Buildings north to Parking Lots D and E.

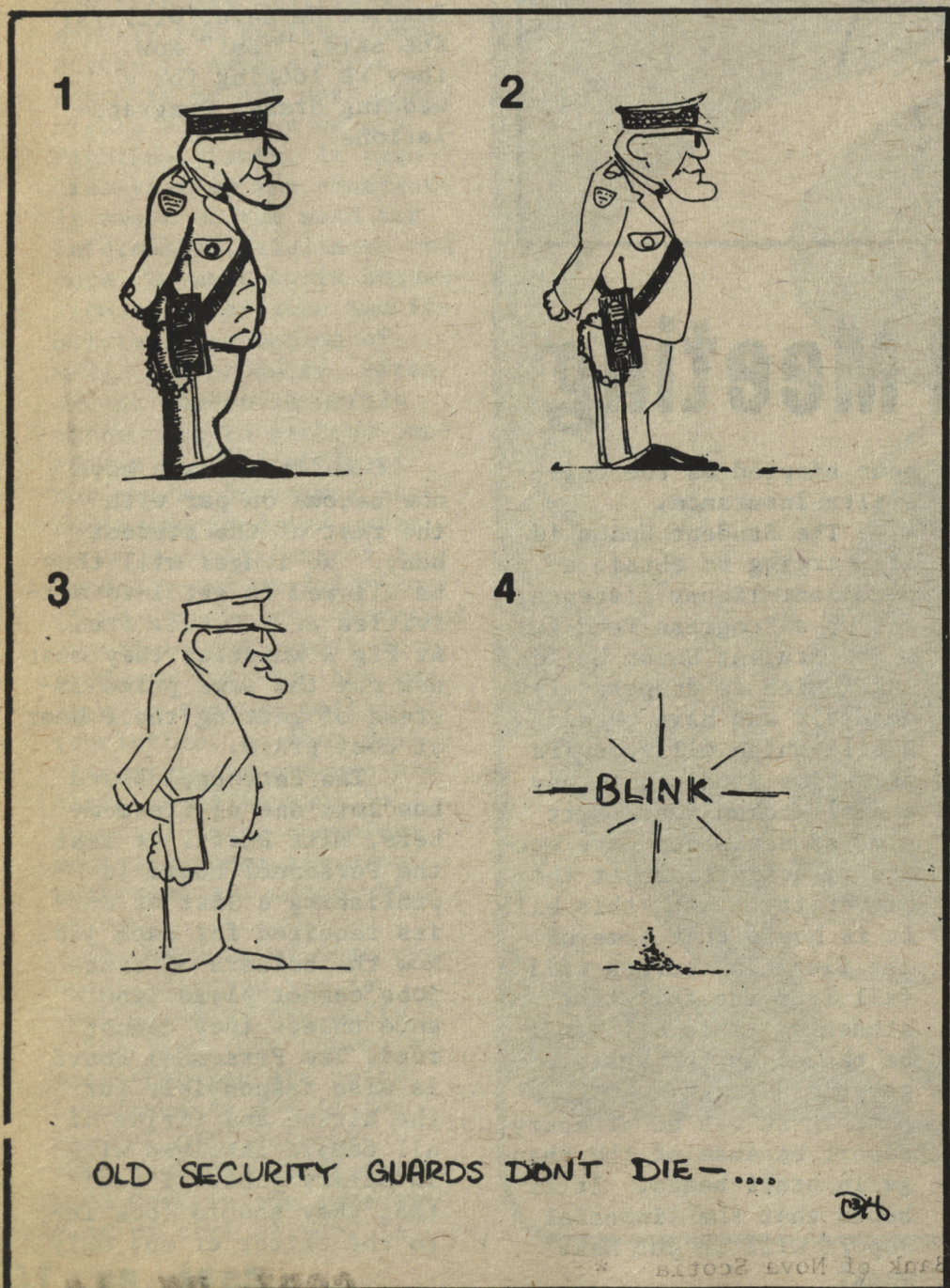


Snow plough guides are not erected to be torn down. There are only a few students causing all the damages. Maybe the rest of us can show some

## UPEI Labour News



Recently one of your Security Officers was suspended for a period of twenty-eight days by his supervisor for leaving his post one hour early, even though this officer had made arrangements with another officer to come in and fill the void for him. Upon receiving notification of such suspension, the person in question appealed to his Local Union (Local 501, Canadian Union of Public Employees) to hear his grievance and begin procedured to have this excessive sentence reduced. The Union then commenced grievance procedures. At no time were we disputing the fact that a wrongdoing had been committed but we were appalled at the excessive sentence imposed upon this officer and our appeal was centered on having the sentence reduced to a more realistic figure; in other words have the punishment suit

the crime? Therefore the Union followed the appropriate steps as outlined in the existing contract between the University and Local 501. After having exhausted the first two steps in the grievance procedure, without success, we reached the step whereby we appear before the Board of Governors to state our case. We were granted a hearing before a panel of this Board and upon stating our appeal these gentlemen, in their wisdom, reduced the sentence to a period of one week; and due to the fact that the original sentence had already been served, the panel ordered that the officer be reimbursed for the difference in lost pay. JUSTICE PREVAILED.
