TERMS OF SUBMISSION.

Afridis Must Pay the Penalty of Their Misconduct.

A Week's Grace Given Them.

SIMLA, Nov. 23.—Sir William Lockhart telegraphs from the British camp in the Maidan Valley that he has issued a proclamation stating the terms of submission which he is willing to grant the Afridis. The latter are given a week's grace in which to accept the terms referred to, which include restoration of rifles and other Government and private property stolen; the surrender of 800 breech-loaders; a fine of 50,000 rupees, and the surrender of hostages as a guarantee of compliance with the will of the Government.

The Khyber Pass will be re-opened in the manner the Government deems advisable, and all the Afridi tribal allowances are forfeited by their misconduct.

GASCOIGNE GOES TO TORONTO.

OTTAWA, Nov. 23.—General Gascoigne will visit Toronto on Thursday to be present at a sham battle on Thanksgiving Day.

The three year old son of A. C. Bleakney, of the Customs Department here, was killed yesterday by eating a box full of potash tablets, such as are used for sore throat.

\$800,000 IN DAIRY PRODUCTS

Output of Island Factories.

Great Increase of the Business.

OTTAWA, Nov. 23.—Commissioner Robertson has received a report of the work of the factories in Prince Edward Island during the year.

The total output exceeds in value \$800,000. This shows a great increase over the output of the previous year.

There are now thirty-two factories in successful operation in summer, and nineteen creameries in winter.

Both vessels are a total loss. No insurance. Captain Weatherbie was the master of the Ceto, and Captain Peters of the Vivian.

MELBOURNE, Nov. 21.—Fire which broke out early this morning, did enormous damage. Many of the largest business houses in the city were destroyed. It is estimated that the loss will reach one million pounds.

OTTAWA, Nov. 21.—The Imperial government has awarded a jubilee medal to Gen. Gascoigne in recognition of his having sent such an excellent contingent to represent the Dominion in the Queen's Jubilee parade.

OTTAWA, Nov. 20.—The Interior department has received a letter from Major Walsh, dated Linderman, Oct. 29th, in which he states that he and his party were struggling in a blizzard up to the neck in snow, and making slow progress. On the 27th they were on the summit where the snow was from 5 to 15 feet deep.
