### Red Rocket Claims And Counter Claims Continue

WASHINGTON (AP) - United States and Canadian officials insisted Saturday they have no evidence that fragments of the rocket which pushed Russia's first space satellite into space fell in northwestern North America a week ago as Russia says.

Moscow Radio said Saturday night that fragments of the rocket fell in the territory of Alaska and the West Coast of America last Sunday. It appeared to the U.S. to "forward all remains" to Russia for study.

The radio report followed Friday's statement by Communist party secretary Nikita Khrushchev that a view of the rocket had been received by the U.S. Khrushchev insisted, however, that no parts landed on Canadian soil.

Although the radio report did not mention Canada, its mention of the West Coast of North America could mean the Alaska, British Columbia, or both.
