

Moon Race Strife, Khrushchev Declares

MOSCOW (Reuters) — Premier Khrushchev declared today that the United States is trying to give up her race to the moon with the Soviet Union.

"We have never said we are giving up our lunar project," he told a group of American businessmen in an interview.

Khrushchev also told the Americans that Russia is "designing and building a super-satellite."

He said he could give no details.

Khrushchev said Russia had no definite date for a manned space rendezvous. But he added that the latest Soviet satellite, the manoeuvrable Polyot 1, launched last Friday "indicates that we can contemplate the possibility of that."

Caution Urged On Anesthetic Used In Canada

TORONTO (CP) — Two Toronto physicians warn colleagues in a report published here to exercise caution in the use of an anesthetic now widely popular in North American hospitals.

Dr. Norman C. Kerbel and Dr. Wm. H. Hilliard, resident physician and physician-in-charge respectively at Toronto Western Hospital, report in the Journal of the Canadian Medical Association on cases in which patients contracted liver ailments after repeated doses of the anesthetic halothane.

Halothane is the most widely used agent for putting patients to sleep in Canada and the United States. Its popularity is based on a reputation for potency and low toxic effects.

However, Dr. Kerbel and Hilliard say, recent medical reports indicate the "potential hazard of halothane" as a cause of liver ailments such as jaundice following heavy or repeated doses of the anesthetic.

Quebec Gas Reports Loss

MONTREAL (CP) — Quebec Natural Gas Corporation Thursday reported a net loss of \$6,104 for the 12-month period ended Sept. 30 compared with a net loss of \$935,372 for the corresponding period last year.

For the first quarter of the current fiscal year, net loss was \$1,919,911 compared with \$697,412 for the corresponding quarter last year.

Gas sales for the 12 months ended Sept. 30 were 234,782,185 compared with 221,261,268 for the corresponding period in 1962. Gross income as of \$1,338,983 compared with \$2,307,200.

President G. O. Maddock said if the weather remains normal and gas sales continue at their present rate, the company should make a profit in the current fiscal year.

2 Plead Guilty In Theft Ring

TORONTO (CP) — Two men pleaded guilty in magistrate court here to charges of theft, possession of stolen property,

fraud and conspiracy in what police describe as a \$150,000 car-theft ring. They were remanded to Nov. 12 for sentence.

Alex Zedie, 26, of Oshawa pleaded guilty to one charge of theft, eight charges of possession of stolen property, and one charge of conspiracy.

Ronald Gray, 30, of Hillfax pleaded guilty to two fraud charges and one of conspiracy and to six charges of possession of stolen property.

Five other men facing similar charges were taken to court by William, 50, of Oshawa; Peter Cenbal, 52, of Hamilton; Ed-

ward Bartis, 48, of Hamilton and formerly of Port Colborne; William Rudyk, 26, of Oshawa; and William Testik, 29, of Hamilton. They were remanded to Nov. 28. No plea was taken.

Police said the 65 late-model cars involved in the theft ring were stolen from the area between Hamilton and Oshawa and sold in Ontario, Quebec and Nova Scotia.

The cars were stripped of their parts then re-assembled to look like late-model cars. They were taken mostly from dealers' storage depots, police said.
