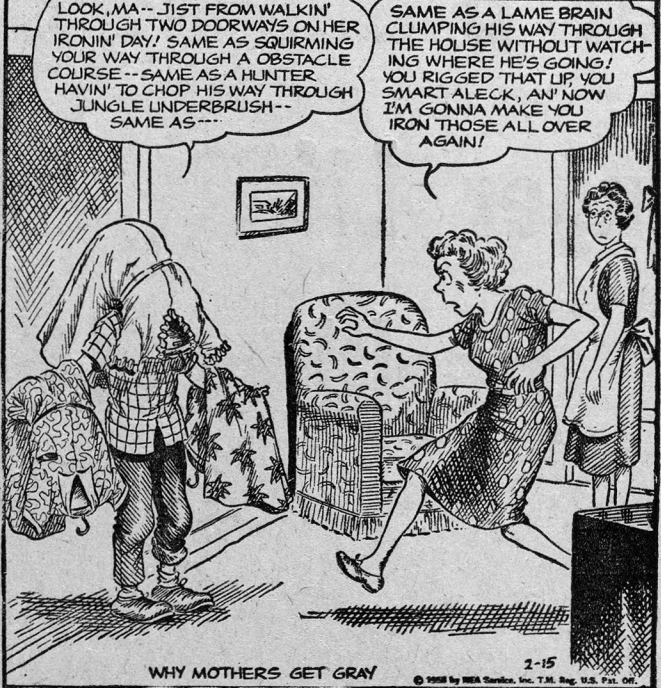

CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP)—The U.S. dollar closed Friday at a discount of 2 3/4 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, down 7.32. Pound sterling \$2.75 1/4, down 11-16.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP)—The stock market rallied strongly in the mid-afternoon Friday to snap a five-session decline and post its best advance in more than a week.

Western oils were up more than a point and base metals gained nearly three-quarters of a point. Golds closed with a three-quarter point gain at a 1958 high.

The advance was sparked by a rally on Wall Street and brokers said the upswing was "bound to happen after five days of declining prices." Buying overtook the mild run of selling which dominated morning trading.

Senior base metals were fractionally higher at the close after Falconbridge and International Nickel, trading ex-dividend, each gained 3/4. Golds had a few strong gains. Campbell Red Lake jumped 55 cents to 77, Giant Yellowknife added 40 cents at \$5.50 and Cochenour Williams was up 17 cents at \$2.38. Irish Coppers was ahead 26 cents at 83 cents.

Index gains: golds .71 to 78.42; base metals .64 to 148.20; western oils 1.11 to 131.09.
