Standardized Hose Couplings

This Province is not immediately faced with the cost of standardizing fire hose couplings because we do not at the present time have a large number of communities with mobile fire-fighting equipment.

Ontario took some steps toward standardizing on the hose coupling of five threads to the inch but at the Dominion Fire Prevention Association's annual meeting at Halifax it was decided to adopt the American 7 1/2 threads to the inch.

Communities which have installed other equipment will be faced with considerable expense in making the conversion, although those with hose couplings of seven or eight threads to the inch can use the standard coupling.

The proper time for adopting a standard, however, is before rather than after a large number of communities have gone their own way in selecting equipment.

Diminishing Returns

The whole question of contempt of court, which came up for discussion recently, is ably reviewed by the Hon. J. C. McRuer, Chief Justice, High Court of Justice, Ontario, in the Canadian Bar Review.

A rather striking point made by Chief Justice McRuer is that the fact that the power to commit for contempt is an arbitrary one is the reason why there are so few cases on record where it has been exercised...

contempts allowed to pass unnoticed. The converse is no doubt equally true. It would be much easier to get convictions for an offence than a right of appeal exists than where a Court happens to be in a position to deal finally with an offender.

A somewhat similar situation is created by variation in the severity of punishments. It is very generally assumed that Parliament by increasing the penalty for an offence will thereby discourage its commission.

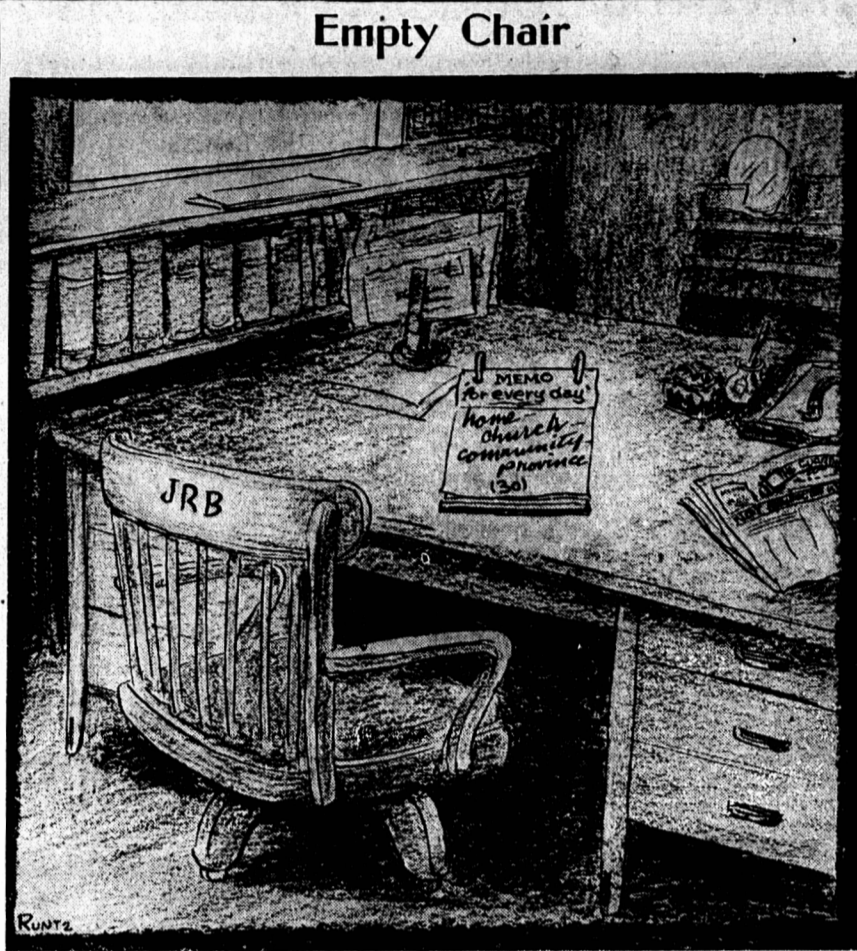

The amount of General Motors' current building program across Canada is \$14,000,000. Already announced are new parts and accessories warehouses in Winnipeg and London which replace present facilities; a giant truck plant at Oshawa capable of producing 50,000 units a year; as well as expansion of existing production facilities at the company's engine plant in Windsor and passenger car assembly line at Oshawa.

A resolution asking a \$250,000 fund to protect the Ontario public from possible lawyers' defaults has been introduced into the Ontario Legislature. Mr. Edson L. Haines, Q. C., of Toronto, who introduced the resolution, said if every Ontario lawyer paid \$10 a year, a brokerage company would guarantee losses suffered by the public, due to dishonesty on the part of any lawyer or his staff, up to \$250,000.

Even in Ireland they are feeling the effects of the policy of austerity. Historic Blarney Castle, with its Blarney stone, is up for rent because the present owner cannot pay the high taxes. Mrs. Penelope Hamilton, the trustee, said high taxes force her to rent out the castle and grounds for six months. It has 17 fully furnished rooms. On the grounds one-half mile away is the famed old blarney stone in the ruins of an older castle. The stone is supposed to give eloquence to anyone who kisses it.

Public Health Administration in P. E. Island Since 1832

From the report of the Provincial Health Planning Commission

In July, 1922, Dr. R. E. Wodehouse, then executive secretary of the Canadian Tuberculosis Association, accompanied by the late Dr. J. W. Robertson, then chairman of the Canadian Red Cross Society, visited Prince Edward Island and addressed meetings in Charlottetown and Summerside, outlining a program of co-operation by which an adequate tuberculosis control program could be conducted.

The following year, 1923, a Provincial Board of Health was established, which consisted of the members of the Executive Council of the Government, with a Chief Health Officer carrying out the actual duties of the Board. Dr. P. A. Creelman was appointed the first Chief Health Officer to serve in a full-time capacity.

Princed Edward Island was not alone in having an unsolved tuberculosis problem. New Brunswick and Nova Scotia were also facing similar needs. In 1925 a conference was held in Kentville, N. S., of physicians particularly interested in tuberculosis with representatives of the Provincial Departments of Health.

The re-organization of Public Health in the Province at that time meant the union of the activities of the Red Cross Public Health Nursing Service, Canadian Tuberculosis Association and the Provincial Board of Health under one central administration. With this amalgamation the following scheme of organization was proposed by the Chief Health Officer of the Provincial Board:

Administration Division: Chief Health Officer; Assistant Health Officer; Medical Supervisor of the Provincial Sanatorium; Nursing Division: Supervisor of Nurses; Field Nurses; Sanitary Division: Sanitary Inspectors; Laboratory Division: Laboratory technicians and control of biological products and drugs; Vital Statistics: Staff for recording and compiling births, deaths and marriages; Clerical Division: Office staff.

B.: 'It was with keen personal feelings of sorrow that I learned of your unexpected bereavement. For many years I had highly valued your father's warm friendship and had appreciated his worth as a leading citizen of Prince Edward Island and as a vigorous champion of its progress.'

From the Summerside Journal and Pioneer: 'Mr. Burnett was a man of great wisdom which had been accumulated over many years as a student of human nature, because there is no better position to study the human species than from an editor's chair. As a result of being wise in the ways of men his opinions and advice were always most valuable and will be sadly missed by his associates.'

From the Charlottetown Patriot: 'It was with deep regret that we learned of the sudden death last night of a fellow newspaperman, J. R. Burnett.
