WASHINGTON (AP) - The birth rate in the United States fell in March, and officials cannot explain why.
The public health service said Monday that the rate was absent for a bumper crop of babies-everything, that is, ex-cept the babies.
An estimated 37,000 babies were born during March, an estimated 4,087,000 live births were re-ported-49,000 fewer than for the same period ending the previous March.
An analysis of two factors closely related to the level of fertility-the marriage rate and the female population-shows no light on the declining trend of the birth rate. The marriage rate over two years, the service said, adding:
The fertility rate which has remained stable over a long period of time, now is showing a slight increase, but it would take some time for this to affect the birth rate.

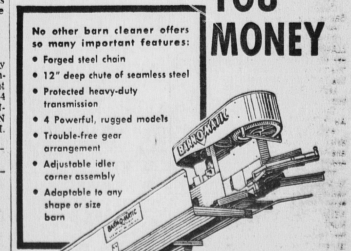
