Western Plant Destroyed With Early Morning Fire

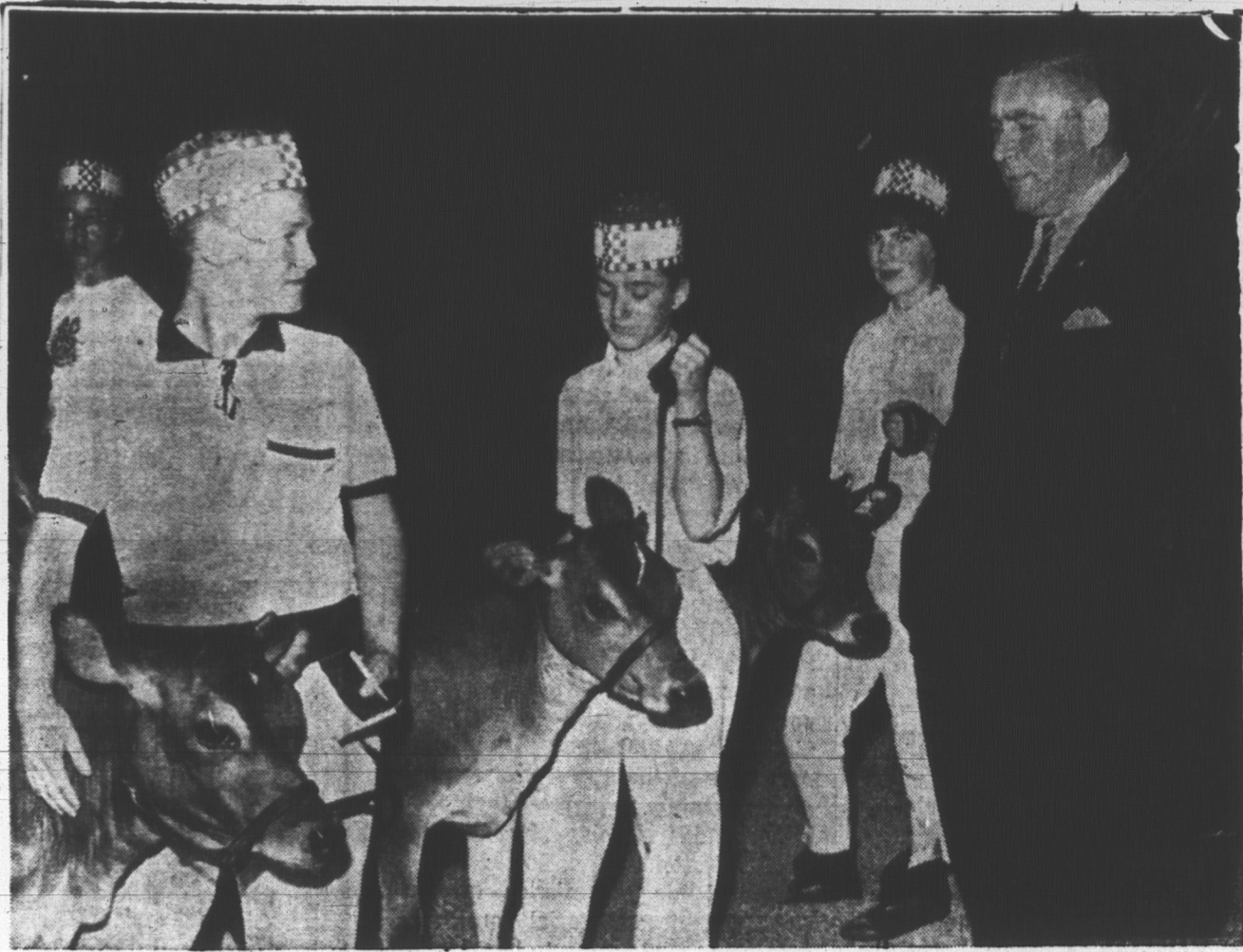
