

New Gov't Crisis Looms In Lebanon; More Yanks

BEIRUT (AP)—Political pressures mounted Friday against the government of President Camille Chamoun, whose term ends Sept. 23. More American troops including combat engineers arrived in Beirut by ship from Germany.

Finance Minister Eddie quit his job—the first open break in the Lebanese cabinet since army commander Faid Shehab was named president-elect by Parliament Thursday.

Ministers loyal to President Chamoun worked to persuade Premier Sami Solh to remain in office until Chamoun's term expires.

Solh was said to be embittered by the election of Shehab, a long time political foe, and there have been rumors that Solh's resignation is imminent.

Reliable informants said Eddie, a member of the mid-road National bloc, resigned because he felt Shehab should be given some authority although he is not scheduled to take office until Sept. 24.

The cabinet at a meeting Friday refused to take such a step, cabinet ministers had talked Solh into postponing any resignation and perhaps staying in office until Chamoun's term ends.

DIFFICULT SPOT

If Solh should resign, it would leave Chamoun in an increasingly difficult spot. He would find it almost impossible to get anyone else to form a cabinet for the few weeks remaining until Sept. 23 and if Chamoun should be left without a cabinet, the pressure would be increased for him to resign before his term ends.

Cairo and Damascus have urged Shehab to dump Chamoun now and get American forces out of Lebanon.

The opposition National Front declared its 84-day long general strike will continue until Chamoun resigns.

The calm that followed Shehab's election in Parliament was broken by the rebels with an explosion that wrecked two stores near the main post office. At least one person was killed and 10 were injured.

It was the rebels' reminder that the crisis is far from over although they backed Shehab.

The rebels long have demanded what the press and radio of President Nasser's United Arab Republic now are shouting for: immediate resignation of Chamoun and quick withdrawal of the U.S. Marines and soldiers landed last month at Chamoun's request.

CHAMOUN'S REPLY

Chamoun has given this reply: "I am not prepared to resign before the end of my term." He also expressed belief that Lebanon will maintain its ties with the West under Shehab.

The United States appeared to supply the reply to the rebels withdrawal demand.

The U.S. Army moved 1,800 support troops into Beirut harbor Friday. The troops, who sailed from Bremerhaven, Germany, July 24, are to come ashore today.

Former Vernon River Man Dies

George Frank Brothers, 61, of Beebe Hill, Falls Village, Connecticut, U.S.A., died at Sharon Hospital Monday evening, July 27th, following a cerebral hemorrhage. He was taken to the hospital by the Falls Village Ambulance early on Sunday evening.

Born at Vernon River, August 2, 1896, he was the son of the late Patrick and Emily (Hines) Brothers and had resided in Falls Village for the past twenty-eight years.

During this time he was employed as agent and telegraph operator at the West Cornwall station for the New Haven railroad and Mrs. Laura MacIntyre of Baltimore following a convalescence from an operation.

Just recently he resigned as chairman of the Democratic Town Committee after serving for over twenty years. At the time of his death he was the Democratic Registrar of Voters and was also a Grand Juror. When plans for the Lee H. Kellogg School were made, six years ago, he served on the building committee.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Ruth (Bushey) Brothers of Falls Village; three sisters, Mrs. Myrtle Blake and Mrs. May Pratt both of Taunton, Mass., and Mrs. Laura MacIntyre of Baltimore, Md. Also two brothers Harold in Cardigan, and Parnell in Charlottetown; one step son, Edward Houston of Canada; and two step-daughters, Mrs. Pauline Merk of Rochester, N.Y. and Mrs. Katherine LePergola of Asbury Park, N.J.

Funeral services were held on Thursday, July 10, at 8:30 a.m. from the Newkirk Funeral Home in Canada to St. Patrick's Church in Falls Village, Conn. Burial was in Grassy Hill Cemetery, Falls Village.
