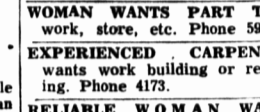

Balcer Will Not Seek Leadership

TROIS-RIVIERES, Que. (CP) - Leon Balcer, president of the National Progressive Conservative Association, announced Friday he will not be a candidate at the party's forthcoming convention to choose a new leader. The convention, scheduled for Dec. 10-14, is to select a successor to Hon. George Drew.

Mr. Balcer, Conservative member of Parliament for Trois-Rivieres, said his position as national president of the party association was the principal factor in reconsidering his decision. "Since the Dec. 10 convention has aroused great enthusiasm among all C. N. Conservatives and we expect a record number of delegates I believe it to be very important that I continue to discharge my role, as president during its sessions."

Mr. Balcer, 38, announced his candidature last Nov. 21. His withdrawal leaves the field to John Diefenbaker, member for Prince Albert, Sask., David Fulton, member for Kamloops, and Donald Fleming, Toronto Eglinton.

In Ottawa, it was learned that Mr. Balcer likely will be one of the two platform chairmen of the party's convention. The other permanent joint chairmen is expected to be R. A. (Dick) Bell, Ottawa lawyer.
