Death Of Cardinal After Long Illness

VATICAN CITY, (AP)—Giuseppe Cardinal Bruno, 79-year-old chamberlain of the College of Cardinals died today after a long illness.

His death increased the number of vacancies in the college to five and renewed speculation that the Pope would soon call a consistory to create new cardinals.

Cardinal Bruno had been suffering for some time from a cancer of the liver.

A sudden turn for the worse a few days ago confined him to his bed, where he received the last sacraments of the Roman Catholic church, administered to its members when they are believed to be in danger of death. On Tuesday, he fell into a deep coma, from which he regained momentary consciousness from time to time.

He died after receiving the special blessing of the Pope.
