

### Supreme Court Hears Plea Charged At Summerside

At a morning sitting of the Supreme Court in Summerside yesterday, Albert James Kelly of Bordas, who pleaded "guilty" Tuesday to a charge of break, entry and theft, changed his plea to one of guilty. After he was re-arraigned he was remanded to the Federal House of Correction.

The trial of Joseph Felix Galant, Tyne Valley, charged with having sexual intercourse with a female under the age of 14 years (two years) was postponed until Monday morning.

One witness, Dr. G. E. Robinson, Tyne Valley, was heard, the trial was adjourned until this morning at 10.30 a.m. Mr. Campbell and Mr. MacDonald are the defence attorneys.

### Display Of Modern Flying Safety Gear Seen At S' side

A display of modern flying clothing and safety devices mounted in a large RCAP transport aircraft, visited RCAP Station Summerside yesterday, where it was viewed by all airport crew officers and other personnel having an interest in the equipment. The display was presented by the RCAP's Institute of Aviation Medicine of Toronto to acquaint RCAP personnel with the current status of equipment now in use or under development and is touring all major RCAP Stations in Canada.

The fields of safety equipment and personal flying gear contain a great variety of equipment and devices which are of direct and immediate importance to all personnel actively connected with flying operations. The Institute of Aviation Medicine has a reputation for developing these items which serve to increase the effectiveness of aircraft in their operations. The Institute's display, mounted in a C-119, "Flying Boxcar" control room, the unclassified aircraft, was presented to RCAP personnel for instructional purposes to function normally so that as many a possible will give the opportunity of wearing and testing various pieces of gear. The equipment is set up by specialist officers from the I.A.M. who are prepared to demonstrate answers to questions and give lectures with accompanying visual aids.

Representative flying stations of each RCAP Command are being visited and although the display is of considerable interest the time schedule will permit to be opened to the public. The display will remain one day at each station. The equipment will be demonstrated primarily to the airport officers and other personnel having an interest in the equipment will also be shown.
