Loneragan Is Paroled, Deported

NEW YORK (CP)—Toronto-born Wayne Loneragan, the central figure in a sensational wife-slaying trial two decades ago, was released from a New York state prison Thursday and deported to Canada.

Rouses Point, N.Y., near the Quebec border.
It was understood Loneragan crossed the border and was set free at Canic, Que., about 25 miles southeast of Montreal. He headed for Montreal before proceeding to Toronto, where his relatives live.
Loneragan failed in his bid last spring to have the New York state Supreme Court set aside his conviction on grounds that he had been coerced into confessing to his wife's slaying on Oct. 24, 1943.

Chile Copper Mines Resume

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP)—U.S.-owned mines and smelters began turning out copper Thursday for the first time in more than a month with ending of a strike called by leaders of Chile's leftist-dominated copper unions.

The end of the work stoppage coincided with submission to congress of President Eduardo Frei's proposals for changes in the copper industry bill passed by Parliament in October.

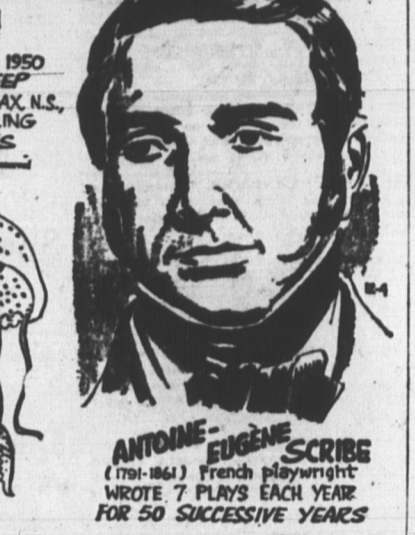

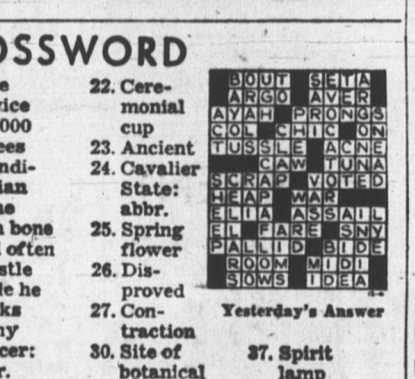
THE OCEAN LIGHTS

OCEAN FOR MILES



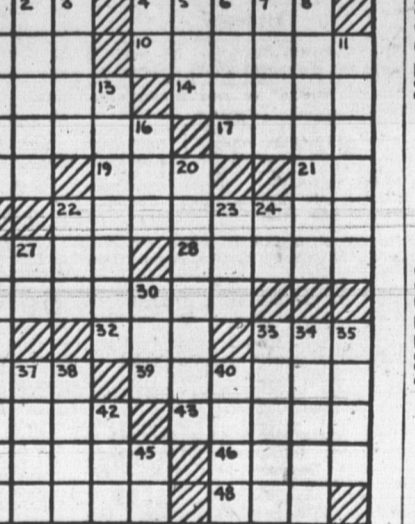

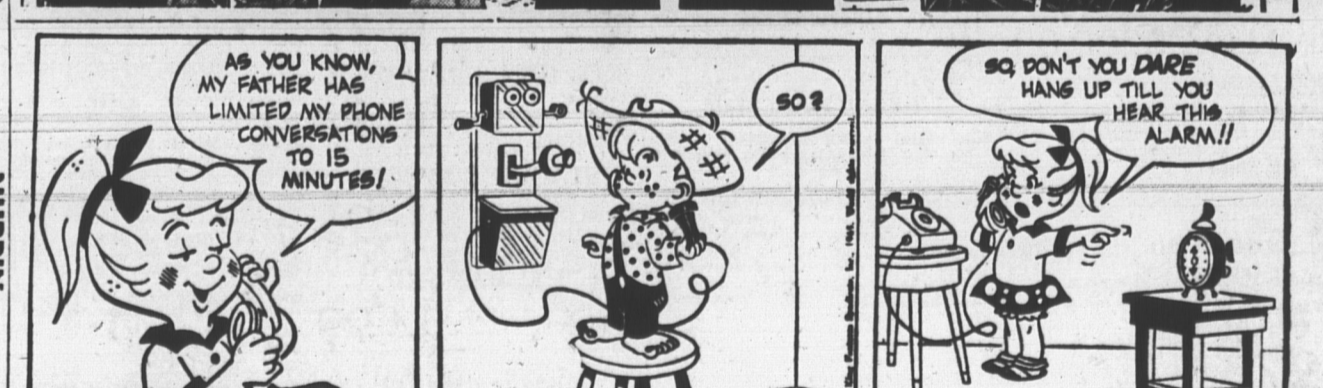
