IN THE SUPREME COURT.

In the matter of an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's reign, Chapter 23 intitled, "An Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies, and Trading Corporations, and of the President, Directors, and Company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island, an Insolvent Banking Company."

BY direction of His Honor Mr. Justice P. Peters, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of this Province, notice is hereby given that the said Judge has appointed Monday, the twelfth day of May next, A. D. 1884, at the hour of eleven o'clock, in the forenoon, at the Judges Chambers, in the Law Courts Building, in Charlottetown, in said Province, to make a third and final call on all the Contributors of the above-named Company of fourteen dollars and eighty-eight cents per share.
