Venezuelan Boundary.

The Russian Official Gazette reports progress in the Venezuelan arbitration under Professor Martins. Both Great Britain and Venezuela communicated historical documents and maps to support their respective claims in March last. The British case comprised eight large volumes and an enormous atlas, while the Venezuelan case comprised four volumes and an atlas. The second phase of the arbitration opened in August, when each government handed in a counter case in answer to its opponent's arguments.

The members of the arbitration court have received up to the present time over twenty-two hundred documents in English, Spanish and Dutch, covering four centuries. The Official Gazette says that judging from the material thus far presented, the dispute is the most difficult ever submitted to international arbitration. The two governments must furnish the arbitrators their final conclusions or printed arguments by December. This will close the preliminary stage. The Court will hear verbal arguments in the spring at Paris.

ESTEEMED EXCHANGES

Montreal Gazette: It is likely that legislation will be introduced in the British House of Commons to legalize the bar that has been attached to the institution from time immemorial. The idea of cutting an underground way to the House of Lords refreshment rooms, so that members may get their accustomed beverages, and still claim to have no bar of their own, has evidently not entered the English head. There are still points of difference between Great Britain and Canada.
