Komati was held from January 31 to June 11, without trial under South Africa's anti-terrorism laws. The only charge to be laid against him yet is malicious damage to property.

While Komati had originally pleaded guilty, he changed his plea in early August to not guilty on the grounds of temporary insanity, following hallucinations in his prison cell.

A group of women representing a number of women's ligroups held a stand-in in restrooms at Stapleton International Airport in Denver, Colo., to protest pay toilets there.

The women were urging the airport to not renew its contract with the pay toilet company when it expires in 1976. The protesters particularly objected to the added burden on women. All pay toilets in the women's restrooms require money while the men at least have free urinals. "There are four times as many pay toilets in this airport for women as three
