

Scholarships & bursaries

THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE ON MENTAL RETARDATION

The award offers up to \$1,000 per year for two years, to students who have identified a particular area of enquiry and require funds to offset the costs of dissertation research funds of program of study. In addition to the financial support, the award provides the opportunity for attendance at a one-week period of orientation training at the National Institute on Mental Retardation with prepaid tuition, training and living cost. Tenable in a wide area of study including sociology, psychology, education, physical education, ect. Deadline is April 14.

PARKS CANADA UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR REGISTERED INDIANS AND INUIT PEOPLE

The disciplines supported by Parks Canada are forestry, Wildlife, Renewable Resources, Natural Sciences, Outdoor Recreation, Environmental Studies, Interpretation and Extension Canadian Historical Archaeology,

Restoration Architecture. VALUED at \$1,000. for a twelve-month period, (eligible for reinstatement). DEADLINE is APRIL 15.

THE CANADIAN HUMAN RIGHTS FOUNDATION

The Canadian Human Rights Foundation is offering again annual grants of \$5,000. to writers, university graduates, undergraduates and others, to assist them in the preparation of a book, dissertation or other work dealing with some aspect of human rights in Canada. DEADLINE is APRIL 15.

THE HELEN HERRING SCHOLARSHIPS

The Helen Herring Scholarship of \$500. will be awarded to a student from Prince Edward Island, who by September, is enrolled in a university program leading to a degree in Home Economics. Scholarship applications and regulations are available from the Registrar's Office and Student Services. DEADLINE IS APRIL 30.

S.R. LAYCOCK BURSARY

A bursary for Studies in Community Health Education has been established by the Canadian Health Education Society. It will be awarded to Canadian Residents registered for Graduate studies in Health Education in Canada, or elsewhere. The bursary will be made on the understanding that the recipient accepts employment in Canada upon completion of his or her studies. A sum of \$500. is to be awarded annually. DEADLINE IS APRIL 30.

THE NORTH ATLANTIC TREATY ORGANIZATION

The aim of the NATO Fellowship Programme is to promote study and research leading to publication on aspects relevant to the North Atlantic Alliance. Each Fellow will be awarded the sum of 23,000 Belgian francs per month. Grants will normally be for a period of two to four months but can be extended to six months. DEADLINE IS APRIL 30.

DESIGN CANADA

The National Design

Council and the federal Department of Industry Trade and Commerce offer a program of scholarship to encourage advanced study in the field of design. Scholarships are available to practicing designers and design students for advanced design studies at the best international schools of design. DEADLINE IS APRIL 30.
