Says State Is In Business

VICTORIA (CP)—Government invasion of private business is one of the most serious threats to Canada's free enterprise system, the Canadian Chamber of Commerce was told Thursday.

Grant McConachie, president of the Canadian Pacific Airlines said in an address to the 28th annual convention of the chamber that the state today is invading the grounds of private business in Canada.

His remarks were contained in copies of his speech made available to the press in advance of delivery.

Mr. McConachie said such intrusion is "a home-grown hazard" to the free enterprise system.

"In an increasing number of activities there seems to be a theory that the government can look after us better than we can look after ourselves.

"This intrusion into business and industry is tolerated and even welcomed by many in the belief that somehow these government enterprises benefit the people in contrast to the 'selfish' profit motives of private enterprise," Mr. McConachie said.

He said a government enterprise, particularly a government monopoly, suffers from the weaknesses of socialism, the lack of competitive drive, the virtual elimination of incentive, the removal of consumer choice and the absence of any effective yardstick of efficiency."

Mr. McConachie was a member of a panel discussing the responsibilities of freedom. The other speaker was Marcel Faribault of Montreal, president and general manager of the General Trust of Canada.

The panel was the last of the workshops held during the four-day convention which began here Monday.
