countries will be increased Jan. 1. The increases, originally announced last August, are in line with a new rate structure being adopted by the universal postal convention. The move does not affect letters and postcards to the United States, Britain, Ireland, France, the Commonwealth, Spain, the West Indies or Central and South America. Letter rates to other countries will jump to 10 cents from six on the first ounce and to six cents from four on each additional ounce. Postcards will be six cents instead of four. Higher rates for printer matter and samples will apply to all countries except the U.S., Central and South America and Spain. The increase is to four cents from three on the first two ounces. Each additional two ounces will cost two cents instead of one. A new 10-cent airmail rate for postcards will apply uniformly to all countries except the U.S., Central and South America and Spain, which remains at eight. Overseas postcards now are charged regular airmail letter rates.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

BIDDING QUIZ You are the dealer, both sides vulnerable. What would you bid with each of the following five hands? 1. ♠AQ74 ♥- ♦A76 ♣KJ53 2. ♠Q7 ♥AQ4 ♦AJ764 ♣A75 3. ♠AJ92 ♥AJ92 ♦7 ♣AJ92 4. ♠A83 ♥AQ6 ♦AJ854 ♣K7 5. ♠4 ♥J7532 ♣AKQJ8 ♠A8 characteristics, it would be wrong to open with one no-trump. While this would show a balanced hand and well-scattered strength, it would also show 16 to 18 high-card points whereas actually the hand has 19 points. It is best to stick to a system when you play it. Too many games and slams can be lost by exceeding the point limit. 3. One club. This follows the general rule that when you have three four-card suits, you open in the suit below the singleton. This is the most economical way of showing all three suits. 4. One notrump. It is best to avoid the opening bid of a diamond because you would then have a difficult rebid problem if partner responded with a heart, a spade or a notrump. An opening notrump bid much tells the story of your hand in one fell swoop. Simplest is best. 5. One heart. Here you follow the general rule of bidding the higher ranking suit first. The diamonds are of course of much better quality, but that has little bearing on which suit to open with. The point is that if partner has any three hearts, the suit is playable as trump, and opening the bidding with a diamond and following this with a heart bid of some sort will not tell your partner that you have five hearts.
