WASHINGTON (AP) — The defence department requested Thursday a draft quota of 45,224 men in December, the biggest quota since the Korean War. This compares with 36,600 called for in the November quota.

in Puericulture and Care of the Sick Child

Through the cooperation of the Government of the Province of Quebec and the Centenary Commission of Canada, l' Hopital Marie Enfant, Montreal will enrol in January, 1966 two students from each province and two Indians in its School of Puericulture and Care of the sick child. This will be the hospital's contribution to Canadian unity.

The training period is 18 months and instruction will be in both French and English.

Applicants must be between the ages of 17½ and 30 and have Junior University Matriculation standing. The Hospital Marie Enfant will assume the cost of travelling and school expenses including room, board, laundry supplies and uniforms. An allowance of \$333.00 for the period will also be paid each student.

Interested students should apply to the Department of Education, Charlottetown before October 30, 1965.
