U.S. Demands Release Of Airmen By Hungary

BUDAPEST, Dec. 4 — (CP) — The United States today demanded that Hungary free four crew members and return the C-47 transport plane forced down by Soviet fighters Nov. 19 on a flight from West Germany to Yugoslavia.
Some diplomatic observers said the demand would be met comparatively soon.
They said that a Hungarian note Monday and a previous Soviet news agency account charged that the plane was intended for dumping spies into Hungary, but did not accuse the four U. S. Air Force men themselves of such activities.
George Abbott, U. S. charge d'affaires, asked release of the aviators and their plane when he called on Foreign Minister Karoly Kiss today. A formal note later made the same request.
(Diplomatic officials in Washington said Abbott was not allowed to see the fliers but reported he was assured they were in Hungarian custody and in good health. They said a separate protest might go later to Moscow.)
Abbott refused to make any prediction as to whether the demand might be met, but he said Kiss promised to pass it on to the proper authorities.
In his talk with the Foreign Minister, Abbott stressed that all American planes such as the C-47 carry spare parachutes, extra blankets and a radio "substantially packed" for parachuting in case of an emergency. He explained that the radio could send SOS calls and a kit of maps also was provided to enable the crew to determine its location.

"On Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, funeral service for George Campbell Bell, teacher and vice-principal of North Battleford Collegiate was held from Third Avenue United Church with Masonic rites. The service was conducted by Rev. Clifford Elliott, D.D., and the crowd which filled the church and the great bank of floral offerings at the chancel attested to the affection and esteem in which Mr. Bell was held.
