WAS FOUNDER'S DESCENDANT

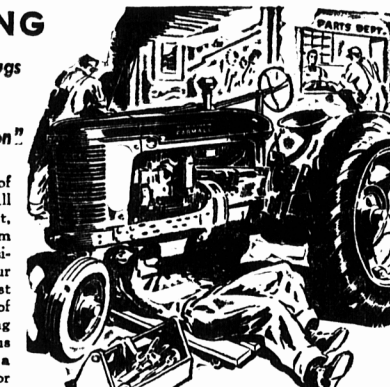
