Canada's Farmers Hit, Report Indicates

ROME (AP) — Canada tared the worst a m o a g countries where farmers net incomes fell last year, the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization annual review has reported.
The fall was 24 per cent. It brought net farm incomes in Canada in 1961 to the lowest level since 1945. Farmers cash incomes, however, rose because of sales from previous years' stocks, the report said.
In Britain, Austria, Italy, the United States, France, Greece and Poland net farm incomes went up by nine per cent in 1961. In Japan the increase was seven per cent and in Yugoslavia and Norway five per cent.
