Liberal Leader Alex Matheson today branded as "non-sense" and "uninformed," a statement by Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae last night that it is "calous election bait", it "could ruin the province's potato industry."

Mr. Matheson said it has strengthened the potato market so much — it amounts to \$125 a car — it's worth a million dollars to the industry right now.

Land Use Committee Reports To Senate

OTTAWA (CP)—The Senate committee on land use in Canada has reported on its work during Parliament's last session listing recommendations for full utilization of the country's rural areas.

The committee was set up several years ago to promote interest in the Agricultural Rehabilitation and Development Act and hear suggestions from the provinces for the development of rural land. Its chairman is Senator Arthur M. Pearson of Saskatchewan, who labored the report.

The report lists highlights of the recommendations put to the committee in a series of briefs. They included: More detailed research and study in long-range planning of land use; vocational agricultural training and generally improving the skills of farm workers so they can also get off-farm jobs; development of soil and water resources, and the development of rural industrialization.

The committee also was told that more efforts should be made to "switch submarginal croplands to more effective uses such as grazing, forestry and recreation. The formation of local committees to supervise local development was recommended.

URGE MORE CREDIT
The report says there was a call for more farm credit and training for farm business management. One brief recommended a rural development fund.

Extension services were also urged as part of the ARDA program. "It was believed that a new kind of rural development extension agent with a background in agriculture, training in organization of community activities and group dynamics, ability to motivate and stimulate local leadership and action was needed."

Eight witnesses appeared before the committee during the last session to support six briefs.
