New York, May 20.—There was a terrific explosion of illuminating gas in the cellar of a big five story double tenement house at No. 172 Eldridge street, last evening. Many of the inmates were knocked down. Floors were burst asunder, walls and window panes cracked by the shock and 15 persons more or less injured, though none of them fatally.

A tobacco can be made to look as well as the "Myrtle Navy" without much trouble or expense, but it may at the same time be a very inferior article.

A By-Law for Levying and Specifying the Rate of Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for General Civic Purposes, under Statute 51 Victoria, Chapter 12.

BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:— 1st. The rate of assessment on Real Estate for general civic purposes, under said Statute, for the year commencing the 1st day of January, A. D. 1892, and ending the 31st day of December, A. D. 1892, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of ONE PER CENT. on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City, and of all persons liable to pay Poll Tax thereon, made and valued by them on the 4th day of May, A. D. 1892.

2nd. That the rate of assessment on Personal Property for such general civic purposes, for the year commencing the 1st day of January, A. D. 1892, and ending the 31st day of December, A. D. 1892, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of ONE PER CENT. on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the Assessors of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll, made and valued by them as aforesaid.

PARTIES using the Telephones would find it better to observe the following rules: 1st. Speak with the mouth about four inches from the transmitter. 2nd. Press in a moderate tone of voice, not too loud, and distinctly. 3rd. Place the telephone so as to cover the ear, just as if you wished to shut out all other sounds. Do not press too hard on the ear. It is possible to talk and be heard when standing back two or three feet from the transmitter.
