

Falcons Score 5-1 Victory Over Abbies In Week-end Game

Smith-Cullen Win Provincial Men's Doubles Ch'ship

The Falcons moved within a game and a half of the Summer-side Curran & Briggs team yesterday afternoon when they walloped the Abbies 5-1 in a regular Island Baseball League game played on Memorial Field.

The game was a typical city team struggle with hurlers Merlin MacKenzie and Donnie MacLean allowed six hits while walking three and whiffing seven. MacLean was touched for five hits, walking three, and striking out seven. Better support by MacLean's teammates might have changed the picture.

N. S. Players Make Clean Sweep Of Tennis Titles

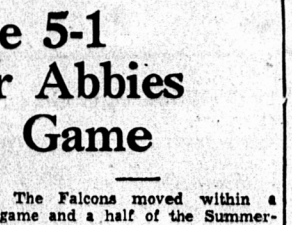
