

## Women Break Jail To Protest Living Conditions; Have Terms Increased

MONTREAL (CP) — Three inmates of the Fullum street jail for women who escaped to protest living conditions were each sentenced to two more years in the penitentiary at Kingston, Ont., Tuesday.

All three pleaded guilty to charges of breaking jail after tell-judge Gerald Almond that conditions were impossible.

Judge Almond said he was taking their protests into account in sentencing them to Kingston penitentiary for women.

"There, I'm sure you'll find conditions different," he said.

Two of the women — Penny Clarke, 34, and Mary McTigue, 42 — were serving one-year terms for theft. The third, Doris Nelson, 46, was sentenced to 18 months for carrying narcotics.

The women escaped by prying open a kitchen lock and scaling a 10-foot wall. They gave themselves up to the Montreal Herald a short time later and were turned over to police.

"We don't mind doing our time, but conditions are so bad we had to break out to tell about them," Miss Clarke told Herald reporters.

It was the second escape from the jail in less than three weeks. Gertrude Servant, 24-year-old murderer suspect, and 200-pound George Tremblay, 42, serving a fraud conviction, broke out July 21 and were recaptured five days later 100 miles north of Montreal.

The three women protested the "fantastic favoritism, unfair food rationing, and mental patients screaming 24 hours a day."

"The smell was terrible," they told the Herald. "The smell of disinfectant and just human smell

because there are no washroom facilities in the mental cells. In our section there are 11 mental patients and nine ordinary. Those people (the mental patients) aren't criminals and shouldn't be treated like criminals."

Jail officials would not comment on the charges.

## One-Armed Truro Major Does Fine Shooting At Meet

SOUTH MARCH, Ont. (CP) — A 39-year-old Truro, N. S., major who had his right arm amputated at the shoulder during the Second World War, is one of Canada's top marksmen.

Maj. Cyril F. Kennedy, who was struck by a bullet July 8, 1944, after 32 days in action during the D-Day invasion of France, is posting high scores this week at the 86th annual Dominion of Canada Rifle Association prize shoot.

He has been shooting competitively for 21 years.

Before he had his arm amputated, he was a member of Canada's 1935 and 1936 national teams in 1937, 1938 and 1939 and qualified again in 1940 but because of war there was no match at Bisley that year. He has qualified twice since the war, in 1947 and again last year, but was not allowed to make the trip.

The major holds the butt of the rifle against the stub of his right shoulder and pulls the trigger with his left hand. The barrel of the rifle is steadied on a forked rest driven into the ground.

That is the reason he is not allowed to shoot at Bisley. There is no provision there for competitors using any aids.

Veteran marksmen competing here this week agree that the forked rest Maj. Kennedy uses gives him no advantage over other competitors.

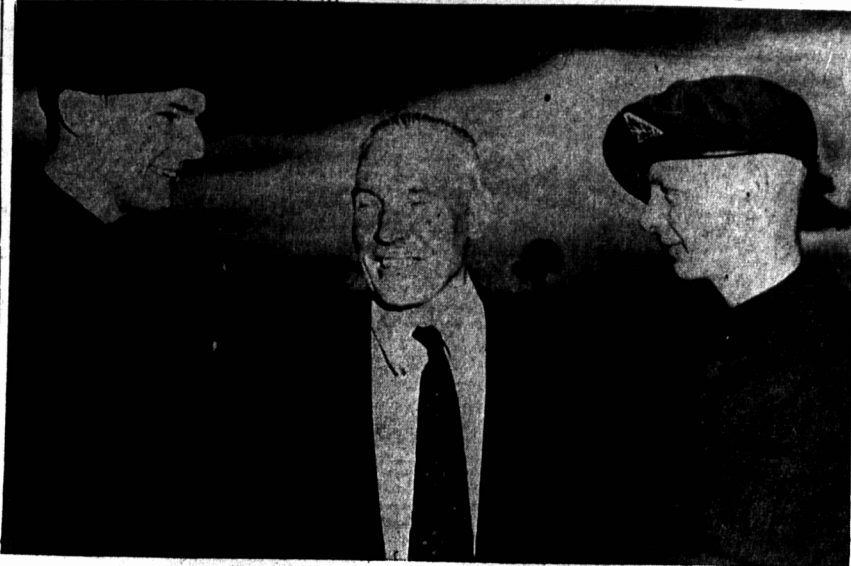
This week he posted a 99, one of the possible, in the Connaught match from 300 and 600 yards, and scored a 96, four of the possible, in the Bankers match from 300 and 600 yards.

The Maritime marksman says he's not getting as good results as he did when he had the use of both arms. "And actually I don't get the same kick out of shooting as I used to."

"I just keep plugging to see just what I can do. Since the War I have been taking more interest in aiding cadets."

Maj. Kennedy has been chosen to captain the Canadian army cadet team that will compete against Britain's imperial cadets in the Michael Faraday cadet competition. That match is fired Thursday.

## Canadian Choir Sings In Abbey

LONDON (Reuters) — David Evans, 11, hoisted the Canadian flag on a tower of Westminster Abbey Tuesday to inaugurate the first tenure of a Canadian choir in the 900-year-old church.

At 3 p.m. (noon EDT), the 40 men and boys of the St. George's Cathedral choir of Kingston, Ont., sang the evensong, to become the first Commonwealth choir to take over as vacation relief for the Abbey's regular singers.

The Canadians will sing daily for three weeks, and three or four times on Sundays.

Newsreel cameras whirred and flashbulbs popped as David hoisted the ensign on the Abbeys northwest tower, where it will remain during the three-weeks. David, a member of the choir, is a son of the bishop of Ontario. Rt. Rev. K. C. Evans.

Previously the men's and boys' sections of the Abbey choir took holidays alternately.

"We are more than gratified by the beautiful sounds that can be produced by a choir in the Abbey," George N. Maybe, organist and choirmaster, said Tuesday.

"It's certainly a tougher schedule than back home, but a wonder-

ful opportunity," Maybe added. "We will sing as much Canadian music as possible."

One of the Canadian works will be an anthem specially written for the choir by Dr. Healey Willan of Toronto, whom Maybe described as "the dean of Canadian composers."

It is entitled, "Sing We Triumph Songs of Praise."

The choir will also make appearances at Canterbury Cathedral and Guildford Cathedral before completing its Westminster duties on August 29.

The youngest member of the choir, of 24 boys and 16 men is Gary Davies, 9, son of Mr. and Mrs. Malcolm N. Davies of Kingston.

ENJOYED BOAT TRIP

The boys are staying at the Abbey choir school. Their supervisor, John K. Edmondson, 22, a University of Toronto arts student of Palmerston, Ont., said: "They really enjoyed the boat trip in the Ascania. We gave three concerts and sang at one service on the boat."

Tours around London have been arranged for nearly every day of the three weeks. On the boys' itinerary is Windsor Castle, summer week-end home of the Queen. The choir's expenses in England are being met by Westminster Abbey.

Transportation costs were raised by public subscription in Canada in a campaign organized by St. George's Cathedral and the Kingston Whig-Standard.

## Condition Of Jim Peters Improving

VANCOUVER (CP) — The condition of Jim Peters, English marathoner who collapsed at the British Empire Games Saturday, continues to improve, team officials said Tuesday.

Hospital authorities refused to divulge information on Peters' condition directly but team officials said he spent a restful night.

Peters collapsed into the arms of a team trainer about 200 yards short of the finish line in the 26-mile, 285-yard race. He was immediately taken to hospital.

MISSING MEN SAFE

ORILLIA, Ont. (CP) — A search for two Toronto men, reported missing overnight on Lake Couchiching, was called off when they were found safe Sunday. John Francis, 37, and Frederick Lennie said their outboard motor broke down so they were unable to return from a fishing trip. They were towed to shore by a launch.

## Probe Source Of Photographs

QUEBEC (CP) — Solicitor General Rivard said Tuesday an investigation has been launched to find out how a Montreal weekly newspaper obtained photographs of the dismembered body of six-year-old Raymond Trudeau, victim of a gruesome killing in Montreal July 28.

Mr. Rivard said the investigation was decided on after a conference with Premier Duplessis.

The solicitor general did not name the weekly which published the pictures. He termed them "disgusting."

Mr. Rivard said the purpose of the investigation is to find out how the photographs of various parts of the boy's mutilated body got into the hands of the newspaper.

"The attorney-general's department wants to eliminate the possibility of a repetition of publication of similar photographs," Mr. Rivard said.

## Acclamation To NWT Council

OTTAWA, (CP) — One man was chosen by acclamation Monday for a seat on the new Northwest Territories Council, legislative body for the vast Mackenzie river district.

He is John W. Goodall, who was the only man nominated in Mackenzie River constituency, one of four constituencies in the district.

News of his acclamation was received here Tuesday by Nelson Castonguay, chief electoral officer.

Mackenzie River constituency includes such centres as Fort Liard and Fort Simpson in an area generally west of Great Slave Lake.

Election day is Sept. 7.

Another dispatch received here said four men were nominated Monday in Mackenzie North constituency. They are John Parker, a lawyer; Peter Baker, a prospector; Charles Brandel Crate, an editor, and Neil J. Hutchins, a pastor and carpenter.

Election officials here said they do not expect to receive reports of nominations in the other two constituencies, Mackenzie South and Mackenzie Delta, unless there were acclamations there.

## Wakes Up In Canal


MONTREAL (CP) — Water was dripping from Lucien Gascon, 38, of Montreal when he walked into a police station Tuesday and told police he had been awakened by a splashing sound.

It turned out he had fallen into the Lachine canal.

Gascon said he remembered leaving his house late Monday night, but his mind went blank until he woke up floundering in the canal. He swam to the side and pulled himself out.

Police took him to hospital. He was released after treatment for a chill.
