GENTLEMEN.—Mr. Blake having resigned his seat in the House of Assembly, I beg to offer myself as a candidate to fill the vacancy thus created.

Believing, as I do, that the business of the country should be the best conducted, and not to be made subservient to party politics, I hold myself free to support that party whose management of the finances I consider most in accordance with the interests of the people.

My policy is to cut down all unnecessary expenses, and to expect freely where public requirements demand it. 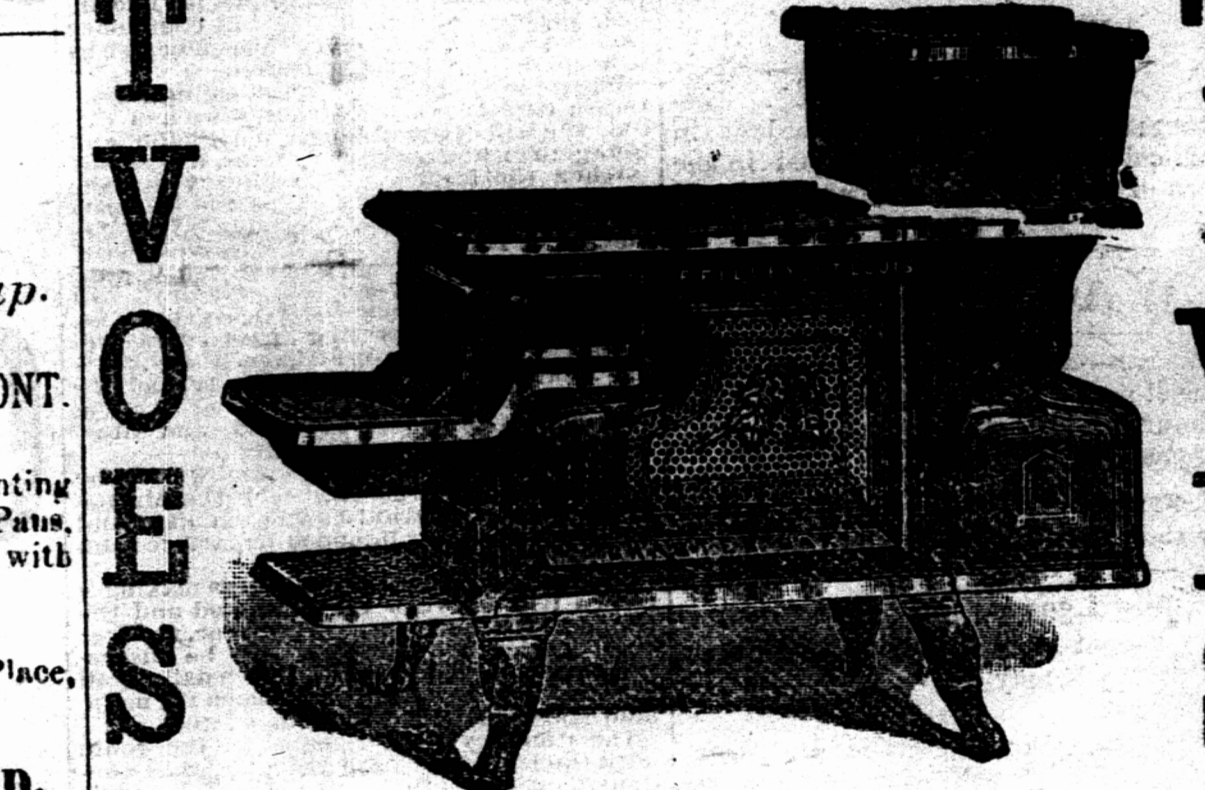
