OTTAWA (CP) - Sketches of the new Liberal cabinet ministers. LESTER B. PEARSON Canada's 14th prime minister was probably better known in other countries than any Canadian when he became leader of the Liberal party Jan. 1958. He took over as head of the government one day before his 66th birthday.
