IN 1875 A GLASSBLOWER FROM HAMILTON, ONTARIO WAS SENTENCED TO PRISON SIMPLY BECAUSE HE HAD QUIT HIS JOB AND MOVED TO ANOTHER!



UNDER THE 'MASTERS AND SERVANTS ACT' A WORKER COULD AND QUITE OFTEN WAS DEEMED A CRIMINAL FOR 'DESERTING EMPLOYMENT'... WHILE AN EMPLOYER WAS SUBJECT ONLY TO COURT ACTION UNDER CIVIL LAW FOR REFUSING TO PAY WAGES FOR WORK DONE. THE 'CANADIAN LABOUR UNION' 1875 CONVENTION CONDEMNED THE ACT AS DESPICABLE CLASS LEGISLATION AND LAUNCHED A PROGRAM TO HAVE THE ACT REPEALED.

## CONTEST

The Prince Edward Island Human Rights Commission is seeking entries for a contest to determine a logo or symbol for its operations. The selected logo could be used in all public and internal promotional materials.

The logo entries must reflect the basic aims and functions of the Human Rights Commission, which are as follows:

- (A) To hear complaints of discrimination from individuals and groups
- (B) To investigate and help settle complaints.
- (C) To enforce the Human Rights Act of P.E.I. which states that all persons are equal in dignity and human rights without regard to their race, religion, creed, colour, sex, age, marital status, ethnic or national origin or political beliefs.
- (D) To inform and educate all Island groups and individuals concerning the development of human rights.

## RULES

- (A) Only work by residents or natives of P.E.I. will be accepted.
- (B) Entries are to be in two colors (maximum) & on paper 11" x 14".
- (C) Only entries received on or before March 20, 1978 will be accepted.
- (D) Only entries submitted with a stamped self-addressed envelope will be returned.
- (E) All entries are subject to selection for public exhibition.
- (F) All entries must contain the name, address & telephone number of the artist.
- (G) Explanations of the entries would be appreciated but are optional.
- (H) Lettering/Labeling (i.e. P.E.I. Human Rights Commission) is optional.
- (I) If none of the entries are satisfactory, the Commission reserves the right not to award prizes and not to use any of the entries.
- (J) First, second and third place winners will be required to sign letters of understanding turning over to the Commission all copyrights and sole ownership of the logos, prior to receiving their prize.
