It is stated that Mr. Henry Perley, formerly Chief Engineer of Public Works, will be taken back into the service of the Government.

The gold reserve in the United States Treasury, which is expected to be kept at \$100,000,000, is now down to \$88,000,000 or less.

The Ancient Order Hibernians of the Province of New Brunswick, in convention at Milltown, N. B., on Friday passed a resolution deprecating religious strife and appealing to all thoughtful persons in New Brunswick to unite with the Order.

Millionaires are appreciated in Montreal. The Star says: "If the average citizen is reckoned as worth an arbitrary fixed sum to his country, men like Duncan Melnyre must be valued immeasurably higher."

A London despatch reports that Sir William Harcourt's budget is having one effect which may prove extremely grave. It has provoked a protest from the most powerful colonial residents against the provision for taxing colonial property.

A late Sydney, New South Wales, despatch states that Sir George Dibbs, the premier of that colony, has submitted to the premier of Victoria a scheme for the union of the two colonies, with provision for South Australia and Queensland.

The Halifax Board of Trade has pronounced in favor of an annual subsidy to be paid by the Dominion Government to a direct cable from Halifax to Jamaica.

KING'S COUNTY EXHIBITION, 1894.

A meeting of the joint committee appointed by the Local Government and the King's County Exhibition, association was held at Georgetown on Thursday, 14th of June, inst.

The notice of official appointment being read, on motion of Thos. Kichham, Esq., seconded by James Clow, Esq., Hon. D. Gordon was appointed chairman of committee.

The Prize List for King's County Exhibition, 1894, was then carefully considered, and the following amendments to the Prize List were adopted.

In Class 2, Cattle, the word "beef" was inserted in Sections 25 to 31 inclusive; and after the word "breed" in Section 35 was struck off for first prize in Sections 4 and 10.

In Class 4, Sections 2 and 4, were amended by adding the words "not less than 4 pigs under 2 months." A section was added for best imported purebred pig, with prizes at \$4, \$2 and \$1 for 1st, 2nd and 3rd, respectively.

Class 7 was adapted and increased by the addition of prizes for 1st and 2nd best samples of 6 stalks of sunflowers, 6 stalks horse beans and 6 stalks of fodder corn, with prizes of \$1 and 50 cents respectively.

Class 9 was increased by addition of 1st and 2nd prize for best cornmaker of \$3 and \$2.

Class 10 was continued same as last year, Section 44 being struck out. Class 11, Fruit, passed with addition of section for 1st and 2nd best collection of small fruit, preserved in alcohol, prizes \$3 and \$2, classes 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 were adopted without amendment.
