Quebec Needs Wage Policy

MONTREAL (CP) — Quebec needs a general wage policy created by the co-operative action of labor, management and the state, Premier Daniel Johnson said here.

Speaking to members of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association, Mr. Johnson said salary standards of the state affect those of private industry and union demands touch both the state and private sectors.

"All this points up the need for a general wage policy, with a wider field of vision than a policy for a policy that takes into account both the present resources and the growth objectives of Quebec's economy; for a policy that will finally free us from improvisation and incoherence so as to focus on the overriding interests of the community."

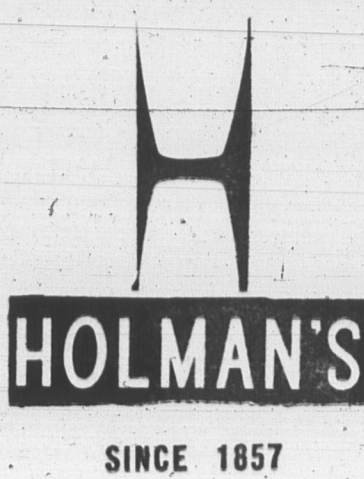

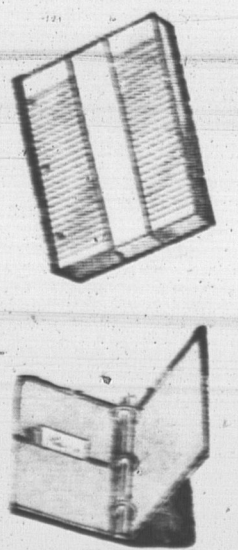
