Mrs. X (I'll call her) rules through fears, gifts, threats of suicide, imaginary heart attack and the disclosure (recently) that she has cancer.

The campaigner viciously against my husband and me, making many false accusations. I feel socially superior to and often have snubbed her and her husband. She seems to be an introvert, maladjusted, who does not entertaining, has no outside friends and spends her time brooding.

In raising our four children (ages 16 to 24), we emphasized the golden rule, church attendance, care at meals and good manners in all instances, consideration of others. We have centered most of our time and resources on them.

Since her marriage, our daughter has given up reading, good manners and church-going. We don't see her or hear from her, though she lives in a nearby city. She asks us not to visit her or their baby, now 18 months old, as it would upset her husband, who at times has destroyed our letters to her.

She has instructed us not to bring but to mail costly items to her. She has charged that we are remiss in such giving. This we do not do, despite feeling that we were being pressured, degraded, into buying her affection.

We hoped also that these gifts transmit larger greater domestic tranquility to her. Now that communication is broken, how can we help?
