TUESDAY

The 1953 Provincial Exhibition with one of its greatest livestock shows and horse racing programs in its 65-year-old history got underway last night with Premier A. W. Matheson officially opening the proceedings in a brief but impressive ceremony...

With the livestock barns full of the Island's finest animals and the racing stables filled with the Maritimes best trotters and pacers officials expressed the hope that the 55th edition of the Provincial show would be the finest yet produced.

Premier Matheson extended his best wishes to the Exhibition officials before declaring the Week's program officially opened. He warned them that they could not remain stationary but that they must go forward and that they must provide a variety of programs at prices which everyone could afford to pay.

His Honor Lieutenant Governor T. W. L. Prowse spoke briefly and commended the officials for their splendid efforts before extending a welcome to all visitors to the Province.

His Worship Mayor J. D. Stewart welcomed the visitors to the City of Charlottetown. Mr. R. R. Bell, M. L. A. also spoke briefly.

Hon. C. C. Baker, Minister of Agriculture reviewed the growth of the Provincial Exhibition and the advancement of the agricultural industry in the Province. He commended the Exhibition officials and wished them every success in their endeavours.

The Liberals elected three men in Prince Edward Island yesterday's general election and the Progressive Conservatives one. The results were the same as at the last general election, although at the time of dissolution of the last House the Progressive Conservatives had two in this Province...

Liberals elected yesterday were Mr. J. Watson MacNaught in Prince, with a greatly increased majority over the last time; Mr. Neil A. Matheson, a newcomer to politics who led the poll in Queen's, and Mr. Thomas J. Kisham, who was returned in King's with a somewhat reduced majority.

The Progressive Conservative elected was Mr. J. Angus MacLean, who had sat in the last Commons following a by-election victory in 1951.

More than 1500 pieces of hand work, a slight increase over last year, were entered in the Exhibition sponsored by the Women's Institute of P. E. I. at the Exhibition Grounds during Old Home Week.

Entries were closed at noon yesterday and showed articles ranging from samples of the once-died art of netting, to a large quilt depicting with colored bits of ma-

terial some scenes from the novel, "Little Women". The judges' remarks indicate that generally the quality of the work was not so high as has been in previous years, although in some classes, it has improved.

WEDNESDAY

A report on the potato situation in the United States, issued by the Department of Agriculture in Washington, D. C., yesterday indicated a production total of 362,835,000. Yield per acre (bushels) 234.9, acreage for harvest, 1,502,000. On the same date last year, indicated production was 335,421,000; yield per acre (bushels) 236.5, acreage for harvest 1,418,000.

A comparison of the two years shows an increase in acreage of roughly 47 millions. Commenting on this announcement from the Washington Department, a Charlottetown exporter said it would appear that if these statistics are correct, there are too many potatoes and the prospects for 1951-52 prices are remote, as the United States ordinarily can consume only 350 million bushels. The 1951 August report showed 315 million bushels and the 1952 August report showed 335 million bushels.

"I am very pleased to be on the Island and I am quite sure I will like it," was the opinion offered by Inspector William Harrison Nevin who officially took command of "L" Division of the R. C. M. P. here yesterday.

Inspector Nevin, who succeeds Superintendent N. W. Churchill as officer in charge of the division, comes directly from Dauphin Sub-Division which included the northern areas of Manitoba, as far as Fort Churchill.

The new commanding officer of the Mounties was born in Northern Ireland in the year 1908. He came to Canada in 1930 with the express purpose of joining the R. C. M. P. but due to a long waiting list, it was a year after this before he became enlisted in the Force. He had the distinction of being chosen to represent the police in the famous musical ride at Madison Square Gardens in 1931 and perhaps his greatest thrill came when in 1939 he was one of those selected to guard the King and Queen in their Royal Tour across Canada.

Inspector Nevin spent several years in the Western Arctic where he was stationed at Aklavik and Hershel Island. It was during his time in Aklavik that he became married to a nurse who was on the staff of the hospital there.

THURSDAY

The judging of dairy cattle at the Provincial Exhibition was completed yesterday with the placing of the high quality Jerseys and Ayrshires before a large crowd of spectators who took advantage of the perfect weather to gather around the show ring and watch some of the Island's finest cattle on display.

Competition in the various classes was probably not quite as keen as other years especially in the Ayrshire classes where the entries were fewer. However the animals that were in the ring were tops as borne out by the testimony of the two cattle judges.

Word has been received by the Prince Edward Island Potato Marketing Board from the Department of Trade and Commerce, Ottawa, of two fairly large prospective orders for certified seed potatoes for South America.

The Argentine Republic is in the market for some 13,250 metric tons. Tenders for this amount have been called for August 18th. The Central Bank has allocated \$1,400,000 U.S. funds for this purchase.

This order comprises the following varieties and amounts based on crates or bags of 170 lb. each: Katahdin 220,000 White Rose 40,000

Sebago 4,000 Sequoia 1,000 The White Rose variety is not grown in the Maritime Provinces and this part of the order may be filled by British Columbia growers.

The Republic of Uruguay will possibly require the following amounts: Katahdin 100,000 Pontiac 40,000 Kennebec 20,000 Tenders for this order may be called for September 4th. Further particulars on these orders may be obtained at the office of the Potato Marketing Board.

Mr. H. W. Clay, Federal Government Production Service, announced last evening that a request enquiry had been received from Ontario in which the intention was expressed to purchase 200 or more Yorkshire Gilts in this Province within a short time. Mr. Clay is much pleased with such a prospect following closely on the announcement of Mr. Stewart after his judging of hogs at the Exhibition on Tuesday in which he emphasized the superiority of Island hogs.

The horse show at the Provincial Exhibition was continued yesterday with the judging of the Clydesdale and the Percherons. Cecil J. Stewart of New Westshire and Irving Haslam of Emerald won the top male honors in the Clydesdales with Stewart winning the grand championship with his Civic Chief Jr. and Haslam winning the junior championship with Favorite Chief Jr.

Robert Chappell of York won the grand and senior female championships in the Clydesdales with Harrison Green, Clyde River taking the reserve honors. Cecil Stewart showed the junior female champion and Preston Bryenton of Rollo Bay the reserve junior female.

Stewart also won the classes for the get of sire and the progeny of dam. There were only four horses entered in the Percheron show and all of them were owned by Lorne Ferguson of Crapaud.

Little May, a mare born before 1950 was the grand and senior champion female of the breed. The Hereford Red Polls and Angus breeds of beef cattle were judged at the Provincial Exhibition yesterday and although the entries in many of the classes were small the quality was very good.

Judge Reg Barteaux of Clarence, Nova Scotia was particularly impressed with the Herefords. He called the "White Face" display a mighty good showing with all of the Herefords being top quality animals.
