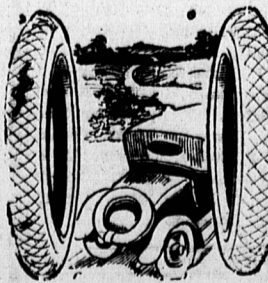

Man Killed When Tank Collapsed

CORNWALL, May 10.—D. Clavette was killed on a Jack Crawford had his legs broken and suffered other serious injuries, and Earl Whitford was slightly injured today, when a 15,000 gallon water tank at the Beach Furniture Limited factory collapsed at 1:30 p. m. These men, with George Hough, master mechanic, were doing some work preparatory to the company letting a contract for the removal of the tank to be replaced by a new steel tank, and Mr. Hough, with Julius Miller, factory manager, left from looking over the tank a moment or two before its collapse. The men were taking down what is known as a frost casing, a wooden covering which protects the water pipe which feeds the tank, and were only twelve feet from the ground when the tank fell. The iron girders, woodwork and water, some 8,000 gallons came down with terrific force, and both Clavette and Crawford were caught in the debris, while Whitford was on the edge and escaped with slight injury. Clavette was dead when removed and Crawford was in a serious condition. The cause of the accident is a mystery, as the frost casing offered no support to the tank, and none of the supporting iron work had been removed. Dr. C. J. Hamilton, coroner, after viewing the remains, decided to hold an inquest.
