## Grain Firms Show Interest In Fire Salvage Ventures

 EDMONTON (CP)—Salvaging fire-damaged grain is an important and sometimes profitable sideline for grain companies.

J. E. Glenn, manager of McCabe Grain in Edmonton, says its a high risk venture that can be lucrative under right conditions. But, lucrative or not, grain companies are virtually interested when there's damaged grain to be had.

For example, several companies were quick to bid when a fire whipped through four grain elevators and nine annexes at the tiny northern Alberta community of Falher this spring. The damage, estimated at \$1,000,000, included loss in value of the 225,000 bushels of grain in the structure.

McCabe was one of the buyers of salvaged grain from the Falher fire.

Mr. Glenn said the element of risk generally makes for an opportunity for higher returns. "You don't always know if you have a buyer for it and you run a risk of contaminating good grain when the damaged grain in the bins," he says.

## Open Grave Wins Award

OTTAWA (CP)—Open Grave, a CBC television production that caused protest in Parliament last spring even before it was shown on the national network, has won a major European competition for TV programs, the CBC announced.

The drama was awarded the City of Genoa prize in the Italia Prize competition in Genoa, Italy.

Open Grave was written as a modern version of the Easter story. It centres on the unexplained disappearance from the grave of the body of an executed pacifist leader.

Several members of the Commons, including Opposition Leader Diefenbaker, protested the production after it came under advance criticism from some Protestant clergymen. It was shown as scheduled, however, and later was used on the British Broadcasting Corporation network.

## New Blood Storage Methods Offered By Canadian Doctor

EDMONTON (CP)—A new method of storing whole blood for long periods to eliminate problems of over-collection and hospital storage facilities has been proposed by Dr. D. M. MacPhee of Edmonton.

Dr. MacPhee, chairman of the Alberta Blood Donor Committee, said here in an interview the fact that whole blood can be stored safely for only about 18 days means that over-collection, particularly of rare blood types, sometimes occurs. After the 18-day period blood can be used only for its plasma proteins and is no longer safe for transfusion purposes.

The method Dr. MacPhee proposes for use in Canada consists of a deep-freeze process for red blood cells which renders them effective for use up to five years. Under normal refrigeration, red cells have a storage life of only seven to 10 days.

Dr. MacPhee said the U.S. Navy has investigated the deep freeze process at its Chelsea, Mass., hospital since 1956 and results were favorable.
