

Blue Bombers Selected As Outstanding Can. Team

TORONTO (CP) — Winnipeg Blue Bombers, who just made it to the Grey Cup football final and then hung on for a cliff-hanging, fog-shrouded victory, have requested their second and third-place choices. They were named the outstanding sports team in the country last year after a real fight with Toronto Maple Leafs, Stanley Cup champions.

The Bombers won out in the 26th annual Canadian Press poll to name the three outstanding teams — any sport, professional or amateur, in order and the Bombers got the nod by the narrowest of margins. Commander and second choice were the 285 points against 282 for Leafs. Seventeen others were mentioned but they were nowhere.

Bombers, who capitalized on a last-second misplayed play in the final of the Calgary Stampede to win the Western Football Conference playoff and then defeated the Edmonton Eskimos in a 27-20 victory, were named the record-breaking 1962 champions.

They also got 53 second place votes and 48 first place votes against 24 by the hockey titlholders.

Third place went to a pair of figure skaters, Orla and Maria Jelinek of Brantford, Ont., who defeated competitors from 16 countries with a world-winning performance last spring in Toronto.

They picked up 96 points on 12 first places, 16 second and 28 third. Fourth place went to the Regina curling rink skipped by Ernie Richardson that won the national title last March in Kitchener, Ont., and then went to Scotland and made a clean sweep in the world champions.

The Richardsons just beat out Montreal Canadiens and Detroit Red Wings of the NHL; the Tiger-Cats, Montreal Alouettes of the Eastern Football Conference and Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Western Conference; Lethbridge Nationals, Canadian senior basketball champions; Hamilton Red Wings, Memorial Cup winners and Trail Smoke Eaters, Allan Cup champions.

Other teams mentioned included: Montreal Canadiens and Detroit Red Wings of the NHL; the Tiger-Cats, Montreal Alouettes of the Eastern Football Conference and Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Western Conference; Lethbridge Nationals, Canadian senior basketball champions; Hamilton Red Wings, Memorial Cup winners and Trail Smoke Eaters, Allan Cup champions.

They got out of the Calgary series in poor physical shape. They arrived in Toronto, scene of the cup classic with a few walking wounded and with ace defensive half Gordie Rowland unable to start.

"We'll whomp the hell out of the West," boasted Trest coach Jim Trimble, and many experts were inclined to agree.

With fog hanging just over the field, the two teams played all but nine minutes and 20 seconds on Saturday, Dec. 1, before Commissioner Sydney Haler called a halt to the proceedings with Bombers ahead 26-27. He ordered the teams to continue from that point the following day.

HELD LEAD
The crippled Bombers held on to their single-point lead in the scoreless second part of the first three quarters but it was not until their fourth cup decision in five appearances since 1957.

Bill Gadsby Fined \$200.

MONTREAL (CP) — Veteran defenseman Bill Gadsby of Detroit Red Wings has been fined \$200 by President Clarence Campbell of the National Hockey League, it was announced Friday.

The announcement said Gadsby was fined for his part in a third-period altercation during a game against the Rangers in New York Dec. 16, won by Rangers 4-2.

Gadsby got into an argument with referee John Ashley after Andy Hebenton scored for New York at 17:27 of the third period. He was given a 10-minute misconduct penalty and a match misconduct.

As the misconduct penalty carried automatic \$25 fine and the match misconduct \$50.

The subject of discipleship is not one of merely historical interest, or of a subject which is not a small, but dedicated minority who make missionary work their profession. It is a subject of vital concern to every Christian at all times.

He more than any other, was a pioneer for Christ.

In the passage from the Acts we find one more the familiar story of the first European convert in Europe, Lydia. It was Paul who took the great Message across to this new continent, in response to God's visionary directive.

Many scholars have felt that it might have been a vision of Luke that Paul saw, as the "man of Macedonia." This is because there would have been no way of identifying a Macedonian from any other Greek, unless the man were known personally to Paul. Luke was a Greek, and perhaps from Philippi, he had also been in Paul's native city of Tarsus, as a medical student in the university, so it is quite possible that the two could have known each other previously. Furthermore, it was Luke who authored the Acts, and since he first uses here the pronoun "we," we know that he accompanied Paul on this journey.
