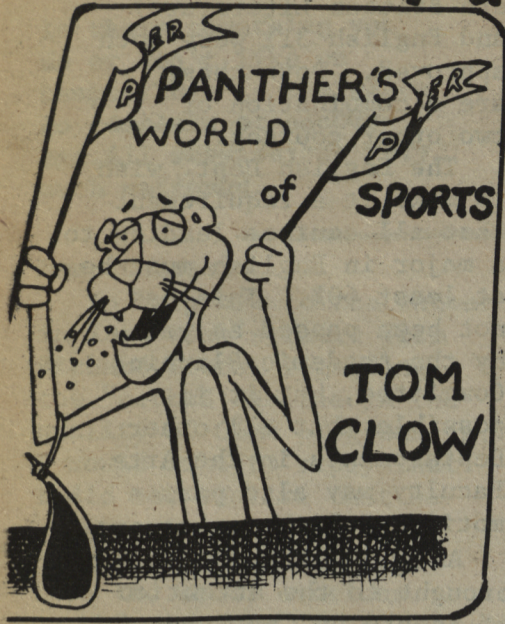


# Panthers Clinch Second in Overtime

Ken Rowe was the high point man with 22 while Millard and High had 16 each.

In Acadia, Alvin Jessamy was the big gun for the Axeman as he hit for 30 pts. to lead the Axeman in 100-79 win over the Panthers. Rick Millard had 20 pts. while Tom Kappos hit for 18.

One big factor in the loss to Acadia was the ineffectiveness of Dennis High. As seen in previous big games, High has the ability to dominate the boards at this past weekend in Acadia, he showed little of what he could do.
