Bridge To Span 800 Ft. Gap Across Hillsboro

It has finally been decided that a bridge will be built across an eight hundred foot waterway in the Hillsboro River. This was announced yesterday by Hon. J. George MacKay, Minister of Highways, who stated that Department of Public Works officials at Ottawa have opposed the use of a causeway in this area.

New Residence Requirement Will Be Pared To 10 Years

OTTAWA (CP) Plans of a \$9 increase to \$55 a month in federal old age pensions to some \$10,000 Canadian 70 and over were unveiled Tuesday by the new Progressive Conservative government.

The three shared programs for persons are: 1. Old age assistance to those 65-69. 2. Allowances to those totally and permanently disabled, aged 18-69. 3. Blindness allowances to those 18-69.

RESIDENCE TEST DOWN

The proposed increase in the means test income ceilings will be \$120 a year for single persons and \$240 for married recipients. The federal government also has proposed a reduction from 20 to 10 years in the basic residence requirement for old age assistance, and extension of disability allowances to some patients in hospital now covered.
