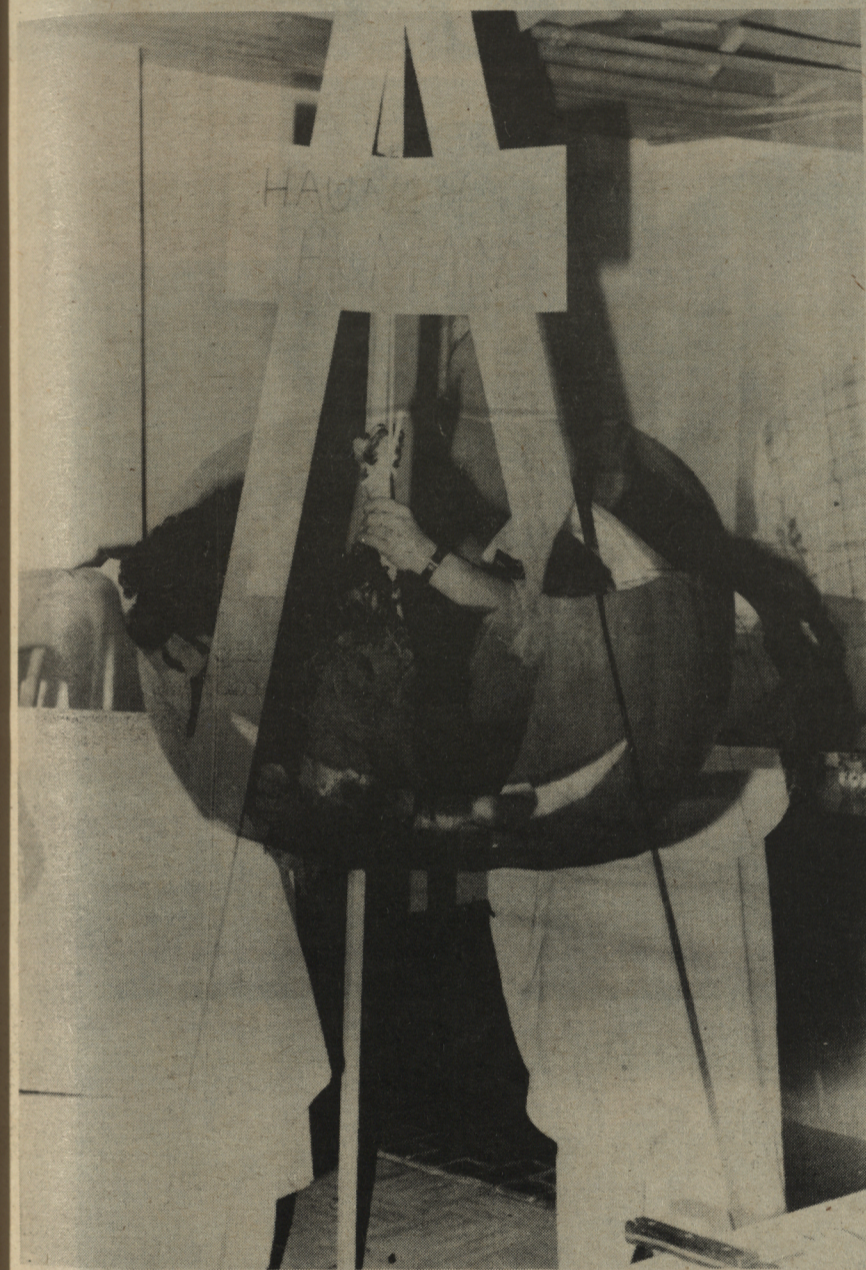
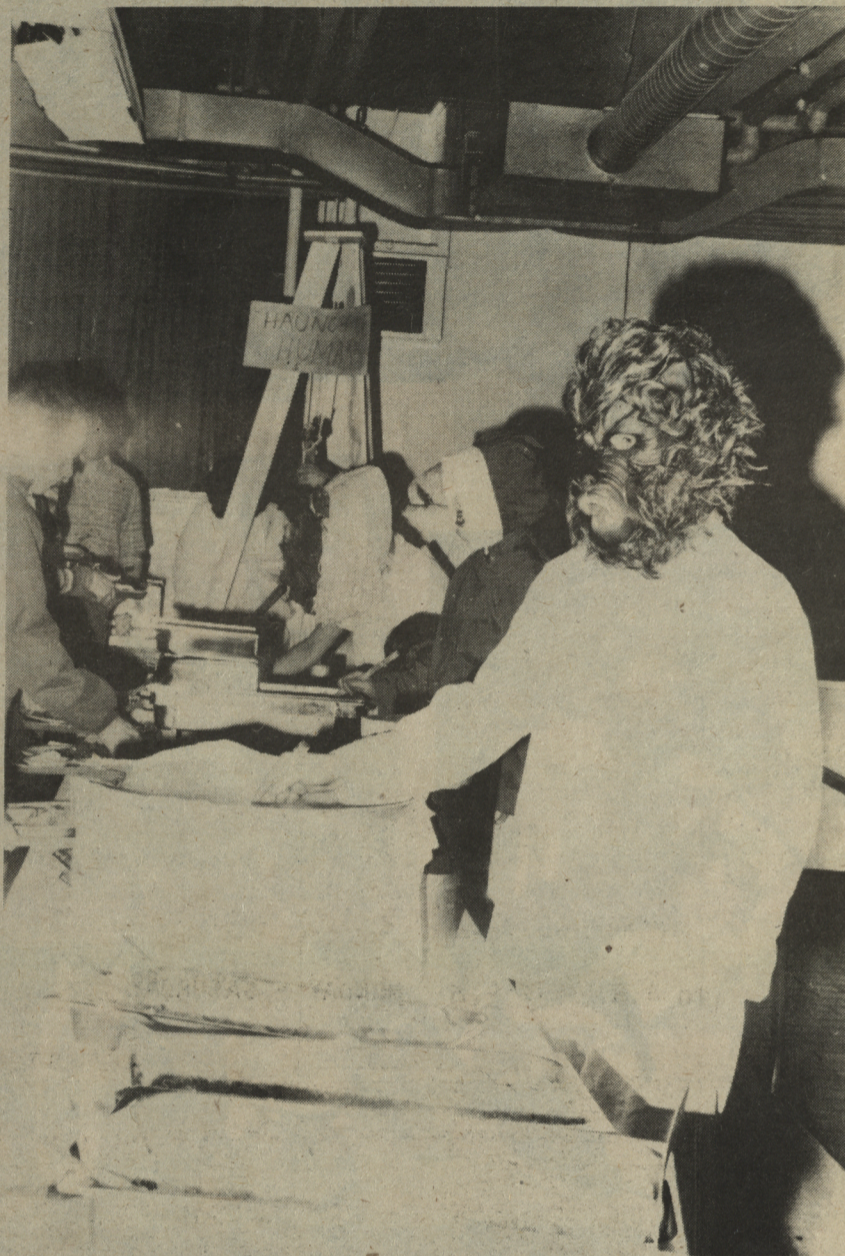

opener. UPEI, by virtue of this win, continued their dominance over Sunny King which extended back to last year's playoffs.

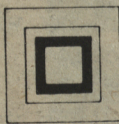
Next action for the Lady Panthers is Saturday when they play the defending champions, the PEI Spudettes in Borden at 6 p.m.
