alarm the continued efforts of the Communist Party to foment rebellion, bloodshed and strife throughout the world.

"Our Province welcomed the entry of Newfoundland into Confederation with Canada. Our welcome was of a helpful and practical nature and all possible assistance was rendered the new Province in beginning the administration of its own affairs."

"Newfoundland's early dependence on the fisheries caused the location of some thirteen hundred outports along its coast. More than three-fourths of the people of that Province still live in these coastal areas."

"During the past year my Government took part in the Federal-Provincial Conference called to consider the question of amending the British North America Act."

"Again we have been blessed with bountiful crops. Prices have advanced, and particularly of degree except in the case of potatoes where the high support price in the United States has encouraged over-production and a consequent depression of the market."

"My Government has continued to lay increased emphasis on Agriculture and particularly on the development and improvement of livestock, dairying and poultry raising. Additional encouragement has also been given to the production, processing and marketing of fruits and vegetables."

"The problems of fishermen are now being given closer attention than ever before since questions pertaining to fisheries are dealt with by the new Department of Industry and Natural Resources. It is now recognized that the development of fisheries on the Prince Edward Islands depends on an installation of factories which freeze and package fillets and a fishing fleet probably consisting of dragnets. This recent development in fisheries is being closely studied and steps are being taken in the direction of modern methods of fishing."

"The extension of the refrigeration plant which was begun a year ago is now completed last spring. This extension permits the quick freezing and storing of large amounts of fruit and of fish bait, both of which services are of great value to the farmers and fishermen of this Province."

"It is expected that Ducks Unlimited will investigate the practicability of opening on Prince Edward Island during the coming years. The completion of the Forest Nursery and the Cotton Farm Beautification plans makes possible, with the co-operation of the Federal Department of Resources and Development, the inauguration of services in forest trees, wood preservation, trees and farm beautification. Trees and shrubs will be available at nominal prices for planned improvement."

"My Government has continued its policy of bringing the roads of the Province to as high a standard as possible. Much subgrading has been done and hard-surfaced roads have been maintained and replaced where necessary."

Horse Races At Millvale

The Millvale Driving Club held their fourth ice racing meet of the season on Wednesday afternoon before a large turnout of racing fans.

The next meeting will be held in the Province in strong representation was made by my Government regarding the inadequacies of and the deficiencies in our present transportation services, and recommendations were submitted for the improvement of existing conditions."

"The health services of the Province have been expanded greatly in recent years by the improvement of the facilities at Falconwood and by the building and equipping of a new institution at Beach Grove. In addition a system of Mothers' Allowances has been introduced and Old Age Pensions have been increased. The policy of materially assisting hospitals towards meeting their maintenance expenses was continued and an increased grant was made to the Provincial Sanatorium. In addition, in co-operation with the Federal Government, large grants were made to aid the construction of new hospitals and the extension of existing ones. My Government has continued to cooperate with the Government of Canada in a policy of providing facilities for the prevention as well as for the cure of diseases."

"It is my Government's desire to continue to develop a system of education through the Public Schools, Prince of Wales College and the Vocational School which will have as its primary object the training of all our youth to be useful and productive citizens. To this end the policy of assisting rural school districts to improve school facilities has been continued. In Prince of Wales College greater emphasis has been placed on the training of teachers and almost all districts with a sufficient number of pupils have their schools in operation. Others are served by correspondence instruction or through transportation of pupils."

"The enlargement of the Vocational School has been completed and has provided class rooms for courses in Agriculture, Domestic Science, Machinery, Carpentry, Electricity, Plumbing and Brick-laying. It is hoped that a dormitory will soon be available for students of the school to live away from home. A Land Valuation Board has been appointed to assist those areas desirous of obtaining the services of the Board in securing an assessment of all property according to scientific and equitable principles. During the past year the Board completed assessments of the districts immediately adjacent to the City of Charlottetown."

"Consideration has been given to the problem of confronting many of our villages which are of a population sufficient to support full incorporation. Legislation will be proposed to allow a special type of incorporation for villages. The tourist industry continues to grow in importance, and to provide increased employment and revenue for those actively engaged in catering to tourists, as well as in furnishing a home market for the products of our farms and fisheries. My Government continues to encourage in every possible way this important industry."

List Boxer's Death As Accidental

NEW YORK, Feb. 24 (AP)—The death of young Levern Roach, boxing's first fatality of 1950, was listed as "accidental" today by the city's chief medical examiner. An autopsy was performed by Dr. Thomas A. Gonzales who said that the 24-year-old Texan died from a "subdural hemorrhage and ruptured pial emissary vein" in the brain.

The death was recorded as "accidental during a professional boxing bout." Roach, a former Marine from Plainville, Tex., died at 12:50 p.m. Thursday following his knockout loss to George Small of Brooklyn in the 10th and last round of a feature bout at St. Nicholas Arena.

DON'T BE AFRAID By Henry J. Taylor

"I left the world for the first time in my life when, as a boy, I took a trip into the coal mines," Henry J. Taylor relates. "But my father calmed me and gave me a formula for conquering fear that has guided me all my life."

Father got in the barrel first, reached over and lifted me in. The cable swung the barrel out and over the center of the dark shaft, twisting us around and around as it dangled there. All I could see below was a blackness and a tiny light at the bottom. The engine-man threw a lever. We started to drop. In an instant the white-blue of the sky was gone. Father held me tight in his arms. My heart was beating like a trip hammer.

I had left the world for the first time in my life. The only reality was what my fingers could touch. All else had ceased to exist. But my father was there. I felt him in the darkness. We were dropping very fast in the rush of air. As the cage shot down in the darkness, banging, hard against the wet, black walls, I could hardly catch my breath.

A Bewildered Boy Don't be afraid, son," he said. The speed of the cage diminished. A pressure came in my ears, and I swallowed hard. A second later we came to a stop at the bottom of the mine. Father lifted me out of the barrel. I was as bewildered as a boy could be; I just stood there, clung to father's hand, and wondered what could possibly happen next.
