NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market Tuesday ran its string of daily recovery drives to five straight.

Volume was 3,920,000 shares compared with 7,270,000 Monday.

The Dow Jones industrial average advanced 5 3/8 to 334.52. Admiral clipped 3/4 from its 18-point gain of Monday; Motorola 2 1/2 from its Monday rise of 15; Fairchild Camera 1 1/4 from a 9-point rise of the preceding session.

But Branniff Airways added 2 1/2 to its 13 1/2-point rise of Monday and Magnavox 1/4 to its 9 1/2-point gain on the first news of a 2-for-1 stock split.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced 9 to 346.7. A. J. Industries was most active stock, rising 1 1/4 to 7 1/4 on 322,700 shares, eIainshroud 1, 22,700 shares.

International Nickel gained more than point and Aluminum Ltd was up 1/2. Walker Gooderham advanced 1/2 and McIntyre-Porcupine 1/4. Granby Mining was down 1/4.

Prices were mostly higher on the American Stock Exchange. Canadian Javelin was up 1/4 and Scurry Rainbow Oil lost 1/4.

MONTREAL (CP)—Stocks moved higher over a broad front Tuesday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges.

Industrial volume was 372,200 shares, mines, and oils 713,100, compared with 236,000 and 914,000 Monday.

Advances outnumbered declines 101 to 77 as the composite index jumped 1.00 at 157.71.

The industrial index rose 1.32 at 124.85. Papers were up 0.95 at 124.18. Consolidated rose 1/2 to 30 1/2. Abitibi and Price Bros. climbed 1/4 to 12 1/2 and 45 1/4.

Utilities added 0.81 and 149.13. B.C. Telephone jumped 1/2 on pipe line to 74 and Trans-Canada Pipe Line 1/4 to 35 1/2. Calgary Power advanced 1/4 to 26 1/2 and CPR 1/4 to 62 1/2.

BANKS RALLY
Banks rallied in early afternoon to close with a rise of 0.04 at 120.91. Montreal added 1/4 to 60 1/2 and Royal 1/4 to 74 1/2.

Senior metals moved in higher. In the base section International Nickel jumped 1 1/2 points to 10 1/2 and Hudson Bay Mining 1/2 to 82 1/2. Among primary issues Algonia rose 1 1/2 points to 65 1/2 and Canada Iron one point to 23 1/2. Aluminum climbed 1/4 to 38 1/2.

Speculative mines and oils moved higher. Peace River jumped \$1.25 to \$9.15 and Phoenix Canadian 25 cents to \$3.15.

Senior oils moved higher. B-A advanced 1/4 to 31 and Husky 1/4 to 13 1/2. Shell and Pacific Petroleum 1/4 to 20 1/2 and 11 1/2.
