Local and Other Items.

THE HOTEL ACADIA.—The Hotel Acadia, Tracadie Beach, will open for the reception of guests on the 1st July next. The Acadia is pleasantly situated and has an excellent reputation. It is expected that the patronage this year will be the greatest that has been.

EXTENSIVE SALE.—The attention of our readers is called to the advertisement in today's issue of the sale of the property of James Laird, late of New Glasgow. ELECTRIC CARS.—The electric cars are whizzing all over New York. The skill with which the cars are driven in and out of the crowded traffic Broadway, squirming here and there like an expert skater, plays his game with his pursuers, is now the amazement of spectators, rather than the application of the automatic principles through electricity or other motive power of these vehicles.

THE PARIS EXHIBITION.—Prof Saunders, director of the Dominion Experimental Farms and a member of the Canadian Commission for the Paris Exhibition, will have charge of the vegetable food, products and fruits. A bulletin just issued states that in this part of the Canadian display it is proposed to show specimens of all the most important farm crops, special prominence being given to the leading cereals of the country.

CRIMEA.—When the aid de-camp approached the Czar threw forward his hand as though to snatch at something, and imperatively cried: "The despatch!" The aid de-camp answered, "Sire, I bring no despatch." "No despatch?" the Czar asked, his fury beginning to rekindle as he spoke. "Sire, Prince Mentschikoff was much hurried, and—hurried!" "Hurried!" interrupted the Czar; "What do you mean? Do you mean to say he was running?" Come and hear all about the Crimean War as told by Rev. Mr. Campbell.

He Was a British Citizen.

The death of Sir Henry Schofield recalls an interesting episode. In 1872 he became British Consul at Guatemala. While in charge of the Legation, the commandant of the porte of San Jose, because a British citizen whom he had summoned before him did not appear, seized this Britisher, whose name was Magee, and caused him to be given 200 strokes with a piece of cane in public. Schofield heard of this outrage, and cabled a report of the affair to the Foreign Office. Disraeli, who was then the British Premier, ordered the British Pacific squadron at the Consul's disposal to demand full reparation. Admiral Cochrane, with six warships, came to the port. An ultimatum was sent to the Government, allowing 24 hours for the payment of \$50,000 indemnity to Magee and the salute of the British ships. The demands were complied with, Geozales, who punished Magee, was disgraced and sentenced to five years at hard labour, and an accomplice was sentenced to two years. Schofield received the thanks of Parliament, and the Queen made him Knight Bachelor. Sir Henry is survived by his widow and son, Henry B. Schofield who is treasurer of the American Engineering Company, and who lives in Mexico City.

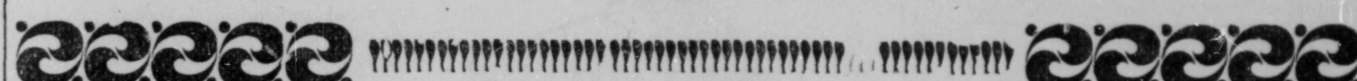

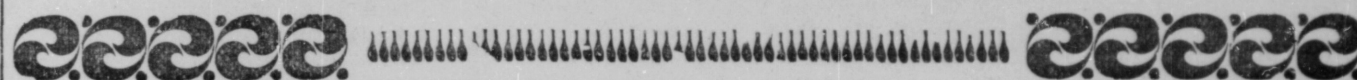
