("Levi Napoleon") lang u e a e e. weights and measures, selenites, etc. Their descendants showed appreciation by rallying to the British cause in the war of 1812-15, when they were the principal factor in the defeat of two American armies sent against Quebec and Montreal.

It is hard to understand the down-trodden complex of middle class Quebec people. The educated are not violently vocal. The rabble-rousers stir up the hot potloi to a state of popular frenzy, with personal aggrandizement a big factor.

In re officialdom Quebec has had long imitations. She holds the "balance of power" nearly all the time—notoriously during the Macleod King regime. Laurier and St. Laurent were twenty years in the Prime Ministers' office. General Vanier and Mr. Chevrier, Governor General and Canadian High Commissioner respectively. It is obvious that French Canadians get the high offices in proportion to their number and qualifications.
