Four Islanders Will Join Saint John Beavers

SAINT JOHN, N. B., Dec. 11 — (CP) — Oly Stevenson tonight announced the appointment of Lou Kiley, bashing Saint John defence-man, as playing-coach of Saint John Beavers in the New Brunswick Senior Hockey League.

The co-manager in the new Beaver setup, said he had completed a deal that would bring Kiley and a complete forward line from Charlottetown Islanders of the Maritime Major Hockey League to Saint John.

One of the most promising players developed in Saint John in recent years, Kiley, has had a wealth of experience with Providence Reds, Boston Olympics and other clubs.

The forward line coming from Charlottetown will include two star players who will be no strangers to Saint John fans, left-winger Don Bellringer and right-winger Conny Bonhomme. Both were stars with Charlottetown in the Maritime "Big Six" last season. Centering the line will be Bill Hagan, formerly with Barrie Flyers when they won the Memorial Cup.

All four players will leave Charlottetown tomorrow morning, Stevenson said, and will be in Beaver uniform when Moncton Hawks take the ice against the Saint John team here tomorrow night.

(Last night Islanders coach Murph Chamberlain refused to name any of the four players who would join the Beavers. He stated, however, that four Islanders would go to Saint John with some of their leaving today and the others following tonight's game. His final decision would be made, he said, following the game with the Miners tonight.

(The players are going to Saint John on 24-hour recall and can be brought back to the Islanders anytime during the season, stated Chamberlain. They are still the property of the Islanders but are being loaned to the Beavers on a farm-club agreement.)

Glace Bay Miners In 6-4 Victory At Halifax

HALIFAX, Dec. 11 — (CP) — After matching goal for goal during the first two periods, Glace Bay Miners caught fire in the third period tonight to out-score Halifax Atlantics for a 6-4 Maritime Major Hockey League victory.

The score was tied 2-2 at the end of the first and each team added a lone goal in the second. The count was knotted again early in the third after each team scored one. Then two quick shots sent Miners into the victory column.

Coach Hub Macey and Eddie Joss each scored a pair for the winners and other team marksmen were Pop Backer and Gordie Miller. Bob Bowness, Bob Hayes, Hughie Campbell and Ken Lauffman were the Halifax goal-getters.

Backer's goal at the 6:55 mark of the third proved to be the winning margin and Joss second marker of the night less than a minute later gave Miners added insurance.

Joss started the scoring for the night shortly after the two-minute mark of the second and Bob Bowness gave Halifax a 1-1 tie a little more than a minute later.

Gordie Miller shot Glace Bay ahead again for a short time before Bob Hayes tallied for Atlantics to end the first period 2-2.

Hub Macey scored his first goal of the night at the 35-second mark of the second as Miners again took the lead, a short-lived one as Hughie Campbell replied for Halifax shortly after the five-minute mark.
