

LAND ASSESSMENT.

IN pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of this Island made and passed in the Eleventh year of the reign of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act for levying further an Assessment on all Lands in this Colony, and for the encouragement of Education;" and also an Act in amendment of the said Act, intituled "An Act to explain and amend the present Act for the Assessment of Land, and the encouragement of Education;" and also of an Act made and passed in the twenty-fourth year of the said reign, intituled, "An Act to raise funds for the purposes of Education by imposing an additional Assessment on Land in this Island, and on real Estate in Charlottetown and Common and Georgetown and Common," I do hereby give public notice that I have made proclamation according to the terms of the said Acts, of all the under-mentioned Town Lots, Water Lots, Common Lots, Pasture Lots, Islands, Townships, or parts of Townships, in this Island, in arrear for the non-payment of the several sums due and owing thereon to Her Majesty, under and by virtue of the above-mentioned Acts, viz:—
